

Ship Pacific South Pacific Ocean Jan^r 1852

329. Friday Jan^r 3^d 1852. Commenced with light wind and fine weather heading to the S. & E. Middle Part the same Latter Part Cloudy inclining to calm Employ^d Mending the stizentop sail
Now Lat^d 33.24 S. Long 178.56

320. Saturday Jan^r 3^d. Commenced with light airs and calm bent the stizentop sail Middle Part light breeze p. N. heading E by N. also quite a serious battle took place between a Man by the name of Cummings and a little darky by the name of Brown which resulted in the former getting badly bruised Latter Part light airs and pleasant. Cummings below sick from the effects of the bruising he received
Now Lat^d 33.12 S. Long 178.50 E.

321. Sunday Jan^r 4th. Commenced with light breeze and Calms our fighting man still below sick. Middle and Latter Parts the same
Now Lat^d 33.18 S. Long 178. E.

322. Monday Jan^r 5th. Commenced with light wind p. N. and pleasant Caught a snafish Middle Part the same with heavy dew Latter Part fine weather our fighting ^{man} went to duty nothing in sight
Now Lat^d 33.06 S. Long —

323. Tuesday Jan^r 6th. Commenced with light winds p. N. heading E. & S. p. 1 h. saw a sail of the sea boat p. S. p. 6. spoke the ship Com-mor's of Salmon's Lawrence 29 Months 900 Sperr. with a few potatoes Middle Part heading N. & E. Latter Part the same with light winds the Com-mor's in sight to leeward saw Porpoises
Now Lat^d 33.28 S. Long 178.08 E

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324. Wednesday Jan^r 7th. Commenced with light wind and fine weather the Com-mor's in sight Employ^d setting up rigging so was fine weather and calm.
Now Lat^d 32.34 S.

325. Thursday Jan^r 8th. Commenced with calm weather and pleasant Employed on the rigging, House hold and the shingle don't pay. sunset the Moon Rose Eclipse p. 1/2 past 8. all clear. Middle and Latter Part the same Employ^d rattling the rigging
Now Lat^d 32.30. Long 180.33 E.
Jan 179. 17. 4.

326. Friday Jan^r 9th. All these 24 hours light airs and calm one ship in sight Employ^d rattling and other jobs Middle Part the same Latter Part Employ^d rattling 2 Ships in sight reported Sec.
Now Lat^d 31.52 S. Long 180.40 45 E.
Jan 179. 19. 4.

327. Saturday Jan^r 10th. All these 24 hours light breeze with frequent calm spoke with the Ship James Lane p. New Bedford (Shoekly) 18 Months out 1000 lbs whale from the Arctic Ocean heard of 12 Ship wrecks and disasters also the Com-mor's of Salmon's S. Middle & Latter Parts light airs and fine weather 2 Ships in sight Employ^d rattling the rigging so was.
Now Lat^d 31.43 S. Long —

328. Sunday Jan^r 11th. Commenced with a light breeze from the N. steering E by N. Middle & Latter Part the same all hands at leisure so this the last day.
Now Lat^d 31.56 S. Long 183.03. 30 E.
