Moderate breeze from the Westward steering
N.W. Mowee in sight ahead Owhyhee
to the N.E. at 15 miles Middle Part light airs
S.E. steering N.W. saw a large fire on Owhyhee
what we call a volcano burning Later Part
light airs with calm Mowee in sight to the N.W.
so ends
