437. Sunday May 2^d 1852. First part of these 24 hours
Moderating Made sail kept off N.W. Middle Part
the same Later Part Wind at S.E. with a thick
snow storm & ice with cold weather
Noon Lat 49. N. Long 165. 57 E.

438. Monday May 3^d. All these 24 hours fresh Gale
from N.W. to S.W. with snow squalls, here too
headed to the N.W. and thick
Noon Sun Obs.

439. Tuesday May 4th. All these 24 hours Moderate
breeze and heavy weather heading to the N.
with cold weather
Noon Lat 50. 16 N.
