 air with passing snow squalls. heading to the N.E.
 25 fms saw a large field of ice to the Eastward
 Minale part calm later part light breeze. none in
 close to the ice formed a complete barrier to the N
 & as far as the eye could discern back to the West
 Noon Lat 58.40. N Long 178.35. W

453. Tuesday May 18th All these 24 hours daylight with
 light winds heading to N. E. plenty of ice in sight also
 2 ships
 Noon Lat 58.25. N

454. Wednesday May 19th All these 24 hours light
 breeze and variable 3 ships in sight spoke the
 Ship Staketa of Bremen and Cambria of N.B.
 found with passing snow squalls
 Noon Lat 58.25. N

455. Thursday May 20th All these 24 hours light
 breeze and cloudy with passing snow squalls
 saw five backs
 Noon 59.05. N Long 177. E.

456. Friday May 21st All these 24 hours light breeze
 and variable with passing snow squalls nothing in
 sight but birds low over the boat a gull
 got 2 Ducks & 3 Gulls seen
 Noon Sun Obs.

457. Saturday May 22nd All these 24 hours light
 breeze and cloudy heading to the N.W. and
 cold
 Noon Lat 58.22. N Long 174.54. E

458. Sunday May 23rd First part of these 24 hours light
 breeze & N.E. heading to the N.W. with snow squalls.
 Minale and later part strong gale from the East
 with snow laying to the sea to the N.E. found
 laying with cold weather
 Noon Sun Obs

459. Monday May 24th All these 24 hours strong gale
 from N.W. laying to heading to the N.E. with plenty
 of snow and ice
 Noon Sun Obs

460. Tuesday May 25th First and second parts
 the same later part moderating with a heavy
 swell found with beans for dinner
 Noon Lat 58.11. N Long 174.35. E

461. Wednesday May 26th First part of these 24 hours
 light breeze & sail in sight lower the boat and
 boat a gull got 5 birds. Made sail & 9 fms spoke
 the ship. Monticello of Antioch 20 miles to the S.W.
 Minale & later part steering N.E. one ship in sight
 Noon Lat 58.11. N Long 174.13. E

462. Thursday May 27th All these 24 hours moderate
 breeze and clear morning N.E. one ship in sight
 under the main top sail to mend
 Noon Lat 58.11. N Long 174.01. E

463. Friday May 28th First part of these 24 hours moderate
 Minale & later part the same. Ships in sight saw a large
 body of ice extending as far as the eye could reach from E to
 back to the S.E.
 Noon Lat 58.30. N Long 177.01. E
