490 Thursday June 24th All these 24 hours light
and foggy heading to the N.
Noon Sun 1st.

491 Friday June 25th All these 24 hours
light breeze with fog, got sounding in 35
fathoms saw fishbacked
Noon Sun 1st.

492 Saturday June 26th All these 24 hours
light breeze heading to the N. saw St. Lawrence
Island bearing N.E. with 20 miles in the Lat 63.30 N
Long 172 W. covered with snow also saw a great many
whales cal? Muskele diggers to end
Noon Lat 63.30 N.

493 Sunday June 27th First Part of these 24
hours fresh breeze @ N.E. saw a large body of Ice
extending East and W. tack to the S.E. at 9
tack to the N.W. Middle part saw the Coast
of Asia bearing from N.W. to N. with a large body
of Ice about 10 miles off shore. Latter part strong
gale N. bore too heading to the E.
Noon Lat 63.30 N.

494 Monday June 28th All these 24 hours
strong gale at N.W. laying to heading to the
E.

495 Tuesday June 29th All these 24 hours
strong gale @ N and foggy to end laying
too heading to the E.

496 Wednesday June 30th First Part of these 24
hours moderating and foggy Middle and latter
Parts calm with Eads saw St. Lawrence Island
to the N.E.
Noon Lat 63.40 N.

497 Thursday July 1st First Part of these 24
hours fresh breeze from N.E. to N.W. with fog
and rain. Middle Part the same Latter Part
strong breeze heading to the N.W. saw a large body
of Ice extending from N.E. to S.W. tack to the East
to end.
Noon Lat 63.25 N.

498 Friday July 2nd First Part of these 24 hours
moderating made sail heading to the N.W.
@ heading to the East and foggy. Middle Part
heading to the N.E. with passing foggy squalls
Latter Part steering N.E. saw St. Lawrence Island
ahead kept off N.W. to end as running along shore
to the West of the Island plenty of birds
Noon Sun 1st.

499 Saturday July 3rd First Part of these 24 hours
light breeze steering along to the West of the Island
@ 7 PM the natives came along side in their skin
canoes with walrus teeth and other things to
trade @ 9 saw the Ice to the N.W. haul up to the
N.E. Middle part trying to find an opening
to the straits saw nothing but a complete barrier
as far as the eye could reach with plenty of drift
Ice Latter part heading to the S through the Ice saw
plenty of walruses on the Ice saw a 2 boats got St.
Lawrence in sight to the S.E. to end with foggy squalls.
Noon Lat 64.05 N. Long 170 W.
