on the American Coast covered with snows

of Harne boats the season. Ship General Williams
of New London & others the season so on

Moderate breasted with frequent fog. nothing
in sight but Ship Jack Whales

514 Sunday July 18th All these 24 hours fresh
breasted & on the boats the Bow Boat struck

and cut him in. Latter part fresh breasted
with passing snow squalled

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515. Monday July 19th All these 24 hours Fresh Gale
from N.W. latter part saw the Coast of America
or Cape Hope the Ship in great danger the Capt
haul the Ship on the Starboard tack heaved to the
South so ends with passing Snow Squalled
the Land distant about 20 miles about E & E

516 Tuesday July 20th First Part of these 24 hours
fresh Gale heading S.W. Middle part heading
S. Latter part heading East getting ready to sail
the blubber

517. Wednesday July 21st First Part of these 24 hours
Moderate breasted heading S. Commenced boiling
Middle part finished turned up 20 bags of
fuel so ends heading to the S.W. by the time
General Bombast & Corporal Stubbs in good health
the Land in sight

518. Thursday July 22nd All these 24 hours Fresh
Gale S.E. laying too under stays in saw
one ship steering to the N. so ends moderating

519 Friday July 23rd All these 24 hours light
breasted with rain nothing in sight

520 Saturday July 24th All these 24 hours light
airs with Calms stowed the oil around the after
hatch and filled 60 lbs salt water the Land in
