

Ship Pacific Arctic Ocean July 1852

531. Sunday July 25th All these 24 hours Fresh breezes and thick fog

532. Monday July 26th First part of these 24 hours Moderate the fog light up the East Cape in sight also 3 Ships & 4 p.m. saw several Polar Whales lowered the boats success in taking one to the Star Boat & got him along side. 10 p.m. commenced cutting Noon got the Harpoon on board so was with fog and strong breeze

533. Tuesday July 27th Employed cutting & 4 p.m. finished 18 hours steady cutting made sail hoisted to the E. Middle Part commenced boiling Latter Part Moderate several Ships in sight the Land in sight

534. Wednesday July 28th First Part of these 24 hours Moderate and pleasant Middle Part Strong breezes. Latter Part the same saw a dead Whale took him along side and commenced cutting the bone was gone so ends with fog

535. Thursday July 29th Employed cutting at 1 p.m. finished and made sail 6 Ships in sight commenced boiling Middle & Latter Parts foggy.

536. Friday July 30th Employed boiling Thick fog with rain

537. Saturday July 31st Employed boiling 10 p.m. finish boiling Middle Part light C.F. air with passing fog commenced stowing down oil

Ship Pacific Arctic Ocean Aug 1852

538. Sunday August 1st Employed stowing down Middle and Latter Parts hands at rest

539. Monday Aug 2nd Employed stowing down oil Sunset finish Latter Part employed cleaning C.F. The bone is end light air with Calm 15 fathom water

540. Tuesday Aug 3rd Employed cleaning bone & 5 p.m. finish 4 Ships in sight and the land Latter Part light air 11 Ship in sight in mid foggy

541. Wednesday Aug 4th Commenced with light air and frequent Calms and fog the East Cape in sight also several ships

542. Thursday Aug 5th Commenced with Calm and light air East Cape in sight with S.E. also 11 Ships and Rip back Whales

543. Friday Aug 6th First Part lowered the 3 Boats for Rip back Whales & 3 p.m. struck one returned till 8 p.m. the 2nd drew came on board again many ships in sight also the East Cape & 6 p.m. saw several Polar Whales lowered the boats & struck one the Toms drew he went to glory a humming spoke the Ship Driven of 110 m out no teller the East Cape bearing E & S.

544. Saturday Aug 7th Commenced with light breezes and passing foggy spoke the Ship Alexander Cropper of 110 5 Months out north saw polar Whales lowered the boats without success the land in sight also several ships a boiling.
