breezes with foggy squalls Whales and Ships
in sight Chasing without success with 3
boats

566 Tuesday 7th All these 24 hours Fresh
breezes with foggy squalls spoke the Ships
Enterprise and Cornelius Howland of
New Bedford saw Whales and not lower

567 Wednesday Sept 8th All these 24 hours
Moderate breezes and cloudy saw several
ships with their boats down the Pacific
saw Whales just at night to end of

568 Thursday Sept 9th All these 24 hours
Moderate breezes and thick weather
saw Ships some had their boats down
after Whales

569 Friday Sept 10th First Part of these 24
hours foggy several Ships in sight
Later part breezy with the Margaret
Scott of New Bedford 2 Whales this season

Moderate breezes and cloudy boarded with
the Ship Splendour of New Town saw 4 or 5 Ships
with their boats down after Whales Later part
Calm with a thick foggy

571 Sunday Sept 12th All these 24 hours light
airs with thick foggy laying too with the head
Baras square

572 Monday Sept 13th First part of these 24
hours foggy sunset the fog light up spoke the
Ship William Hamilton of New Bedford 1700 this
season Later part kept off S.E. for East Cape
saw several ships some boiling

573 Tuesday 14th First part of these 24 hours
Moderate breezes & steering E.S.E. sunset
took in sail and hove too with the main
topsail to the mast daylight kept off S.E.
and made sail Later part made the
Land 2 Deg. to the Westward of East Cape
Lat 67-00 Long 147. 40 W

574 Wednesday 15th First part of these 24
hours Moderate breeze and clear weather
steering S.E. & 4 p.m. saw East Cape bearing
S.E. by S. dist 20 miles sunset spoke the Bark
Cherokee of N.B. in company with the Ship Francis
of N.B. took in sail daylight made sail East
Cape bearing S.E. by S. light wind and pleasant
but cold 3 Ships in sight also plenty of Rips
back Whales no polar Whales in sight
