Friday 13th Janry.

Heavy gail from the westward ship under closed reefed maintopsail at eleven this morning set the foretopsail plenty of finbells at sundown pretty good weather all hands employed in ship duty so ends this day.

Saturday 14th Janry.

Heavy gail from the westward ship under closed reefed maintopsail. nothing in sight. All hands employed in ship duty so ends this day.

Good weather at daylight made all sails run for the land at eight am. raised it off the leadline at ten raised the Bark Stambole started the horns at daylight made all sails got through at four am. the Stambole came down and gained until dark all hands employed in ship duty so ends this day.

Monday 16th Janry.

Heavy thick weather ship under two reefed topsails heavy rain all day broke out two stows down at ten came on so blow hard took in the fourails and close reefed

topsails got through stowing down at three am. raised a sail at 5 am. wore ship, all hands employed in ship duty so ends this day.

Monday 17th Janry.

Heavy gail at seven last night took in the foretopsail blow hard all night at daylight had light winds set the foretopsail at eight made sail thick fog at sun down good weather wore ship all hands employed in ship duty so ends this day.

Wednesday 18th Janry.

Thick and heavy weather ship under short sail at noon weather good, saw one sail all hands employed in ship duty so ends this day.

Thursday 19th Janry.

Weather thick and heavy at ten this morning watch raised a right whale hand iron and line with him going to the windward, did not go for him, raised the land and the Bark Stambole at seven bell close reefed topsails all hands employed in ship duty so ends this day.

Friday 20th Janry.

Light wind at seven winds all gone raised a right whale turn flukes saw him at one Kap ship off east steering east all day until five half to the South East all hands employed in ship duty so ends this day.
