

Saturday 21st January.
Fine weather all sails out light wind, last night reef off from desolation raised the Islands of Proccisions plenty of fimbals in sight all hands employed in ship duty, so ends this day.

Sunday 22nd January.
Light wind steering South East this morning all hands employed in ship duty, so ends this day.

Monday 23rd January.
Light gail from the South ship under short sails steering South East by East at noon wind let go made all sails very cool all hands employed in ship duty so ends this day.

Tuesday 24th January.
Very heavy gail from the South West at midnight took in the light sails put two reefs on topsails at day light took in the jib all hands employed in ship duty so ends this day.

Wednesday 25th January.
Light wind from the North West at ten broke out beef and porro at noon wind all gone very warm all hands employed in ship duty so ends this day.

Thursday 26th January.
Light wind, at ten last night calm, at day light strong breeze and very cold all hands employed in ship duty so ends this day.



Friday 27th January.
Light wind at seven raised the land, at ten calm very large island all hands employed in ship duty, so ends this day.

Saturday 28th January.
Calm, clewed up the foretopsail mend it and maintopsail, land in sight weather greater at noon saw or humbuck close to the ship, very warm today, broke out sugar apples beef and porro plenty of snow on the land all hands employed in ship duty so ends this day.

Sunday 29th January.
Light wind at eight last night shorten sail at daylight breeze up saw a large shoals of humbuck at three ship under close reefed topsail heavy gail, bad weather bad, all hands employed in ship duty so ends this day.

Monday 30th January.
Light gail from the North West steering North ship under close reefed topsail at ten made sail at noon fine weather wore ship stood South for the Land at four o'clock light wind reef ship of South East all hands employed in ship duty so ends this day.

Tuesday 31st January.
Light wind all sails out quite cold at ten raised a right whale going to the windward stood on short tacks all day at six shorten shail, all hands employed in ship duty for tonight so ends this day.
