MAURITIUS

Wednesday 3rd May 1871.

Light wind, at daylight raised the land and three ships came for them, gaming with the Atlantic and the Annie Ann. Shortened down some oil this morning so ends this day.

Thursday 4th May.

Strong breeze from the S. E. ship under short sails the old man and the Cook had a row this morning old man hit him on the nose with the fry-paw and cut him very bad.

Friday 5th May.

Light wind off the Island of Bourbon gamed with the Bore Atlantic so ends this day.

Saturday 6th May.

Light wind run for the land setted it at three at three came to the wind ship under short sail mind made up today to run away so ends this day.

Sunday 7th May.

All sails but light wind stood for the land tacked ship at noon stood off shore shorten sail for tonight so ends this day.

Monday 8th May.

Light wind one sail insight run close to the land some sails in sight mending the mainsail land in sight.

Tuesday 9th May.

One sail insight light wind, had mended

Wednesday 9th May 1871.

Light wind, one sail insight run close to the land, mainsail on deck today mending it tacked ship at sundown and shortened sails so ends this day.

Wednesday 10th of May.

All sails out light wind mending the mainsail land in sight tacked ship at sundown, put two reefs in the topsail carried sails all night so ends this day.

Thursday 11th May.

Strong breeze from the South East tacked ship at daylight shorten sails for the night land in sight so ends this day.

Friday 12th May.

Heavy and thick weather ship under short sails light wind some rain through the day had the mainsail on deck so ends this day.

Saturday 13th May.

Light wind all sails out broke old beef horse and beans carried sail all night washing ship today land in sight so ends this day.

Sunday 14th May.

Carried sails all night, light rain at daylight, land in sight, rain, so ends this day.

Monday 15th May 1871.

All sails out off to the Island of Mauritius light wind saw a shoal of grampasses and finbacks mending mainsail so ends this day.

Tuesday 16th May.

One sail in sight, light wind, all sails out and land, mending sail all hands employed in ship duty so ends this day.
