

Journal of A Voyage In The
Bark Pacific

Capt. Gilbert B Barden

Commencing, October 1st 1878

In the morning lying at anchor below
Clark's point light. Pat & Pilot with
a number of the crew came on board, and got
under weigh at 10 all the officers ~~excepting~~
4th mate Mr. Pope were on board. Light air
from the S & calm. Ship working down the
Bay with all hands excepting Capt. & 4th mate
on board. Mr. Wm. C. Schmitt also on board, as al-
so a number of friends & acquaintances - at 2 P.M.
Capt. & 4th mate came on board. Ship working
down the Bay with light winds from the S.W. &
at sunset steering through Lewis's Hole between
Esquimaux and Kashkurina wind hauling to the S.W.
at 7 P.M. Discharged Pilot, friends & acquaintances
all returning in Pilot boat. Kept Ship to the S
at 9 P.M. Gay Hazard bore E Dist 3 miles
at 9 1/2 passed Norman's Land - and stood to
the S all night. Divided the crew as all told
and set the watches for the night

Thursday Oct. 2 All this day fine
weather with light baffling winds from the S.W.
Ship to the S.E. with all prudent sail out. Noth-
ing in sight all day but two or three sail - all
hands busy fitting boats and doing other work about
Ship. These boats crews and watches - fine all
day. Manuel Pedro sick off duty with the venereal,

Friday Oct. 3d All day fresh breeze
from the N.E. & clear weather - Ship by the wind
to the E & S.E. with all prudent sail out - Nothing
in sight but one or two sail - all hands getting boats
ready coiling lines &c
