

Sunday Nov. 16th 1873 All day mod.
erate breezes from the S.E. and fine pleasant weather.
Ship by the wind steering S.W. by W. two sail in
sight one passed us in the night and the other
still astern. Saw a school of Blackfish but a
not lower for them. Lat at merid 2.06
Long. do 26.40

Monday Nov. 17th 1873 All day moderate
breezes from the S.E. and squally weather.
Ship by the wind steering S.W. by W. with all
sail out. some rain squalls through the day.
Fairing ship inside. Lat at 51 N
Long 28.23 W.

Tuesday Nov. 18th 1873 All day fresh
breezes from the S.E. and cloudy weather.
Ship by the wind heading S.W. by W. with all
sail out. Watch employed in painting ship and
doing other work aboard ship. passed two sail
on the horizon of both 32 days. Lat 2 00 S.
Long 29.40 W.

Wednesday Nov. 19th 1873 All day
fresh breezes from S.E. Ship by the wind to
the S.W. by W. with all sail out. at
8 A.M. raised the Island of Fernando Noronha
bearing S.W. per compass Dist by Cal. 25
miles. One sail in sight steering to the N.
at 12 M. ahead of the island. At 6 P.M.
raised small Sperm Whales on lea bow going to
windward. lowered all four boats without success
whales going too quick. Only five or six very small
ones 25 miles S.W. of the Isl. of Fernando Noronha.
Found Morris & Tobias Chro. 59 miles to far E. and Prods-
ham Chro. 15 miles too far E. going too all night for Whales.

Thursday Nov. 20th 1873 All day steering
by the wind to the S by W with all sail out. saw
in the morning Grampuses - saw one sail steer-
ing S. Lat 4.53
Long 33.12

Friday Nov. 21st 1873 All day
moderate breezes from the E. and fine pleasant weather.
Ship by the wind heading S. by W. with all sail
out. Watch employed about ship Blacksmith
at the forge - cooper making nine tubs. &c
several sail in sight steering to the N.
Lat at merid 6.53
Long by Chro. 33.50

Saturday Nov. 22nd 1873 All day mod.
breezes from the S.E. and fine pleasant weather. Ship
steering S.W. by South per compass with all sail
out. Watch employed about ship. Several ships
in sight all working to the N.E. - scynallised
the English Bark Perthie Lat 9.14
Long 34.15

Sunday Nov. 23rd 1873 All day fine
weather. Ship steering to the S.W. by S with all
sail out. Watch enjoying the Sabbath. Noth-
ing in sight but jumped in the A.M. In the P.M.
saw one steamer steering to the S.S.W. - hauled
up to that course ourselves at 4 P.M.
Lat 11.25
Long 35.24

Monday Nov. 24th 1873 All day fresh breezes from the S.E. and squally
weather. Ship steering S.S.W. per compass with all
sail out. One sail in sight steering to the N.E.
in the P.M. saw jimpers - at sunset weather
squally in the S.S.W. Took in sail down to double
le reefed topsails - at 9 P.M. blowing strong
from S with squalls of rain - wore ship head-
ing to the E and double reefed topsails and fur-
led courses. Lat 13.34
Long 36.00

Tuesday Nov. 25th 1873 All day a gale from the S with heavy squalls of
rain. Ship by the wind on different tacks with all prudent
sail out. Nothing in sight all day but birds &
porpoises & jimpers. No Obs.
