

Bark Pacific At Flores Azores

Sunday June 7th All day fine pleasant weather. Ship off and on at Flores - all hands enjoying the sabbath.

Monday June 8th All day fine weather with fresh breezes from the E. sent a raft of casks in for water near Ponta Del Gada in the W side of the island, the weather being too rough for watering on the E side. Got off and stowed nearly 100 Bbls.

Tuesday June 9th All day fine pleasant weather. Ship off and on near Ponta Del Gada obtaining water. Got off and stowed nearly 200 Bbls today. Sold a quantity of Tobacco and some Senins.

Wednesday June 10th All day fine pleasant weather. Ship off and on at Ponta Del Gada. Got off today a small raft of about 40 Bbls of water today this completes our watering for this time. Sold today a quantity of Tobacco and Senins. One watch went on liberty for the

Thursday June 11th All day fine pleasant weather. Ship going off and on at Flores obtaining recruits. Took on board 40 Bbls. fresh Beef &c. The liberty for men of the board was being up only a few of them returned on board & being absent supposed to have deserted. Their names as follows Louis Stewart, Faithful Waterwitch, Doney Cutler, Christian Hays, and Frederick C. Macomber. The two last came down to the boat soon after she landed, and went off again immediately and was seen about an hour afterwards by some natives some distance out of the village going south with all possible dispatch. The other three were seen about four o'clock P.M. about two miles out of the city going in a south west direction toward the village of the Gran Grande in haste. They had all taken with them or sold or otherwise disposed of their clothing as nothing of account was found in any of their effects. Their showing that they intended to desert the ship

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Friday June 12th All day ship going off and on at Santa Cruz Flores - at 12 M. South watch went on shore for liberty.

Saturday June 13th All day strong breezes from the NW and squally weather. Ship going off and on at Santa Cruz Flores. Ship in the P.M. working up for the landing for the purpose of taking off the liberty men, their liberty being up at P.M. on account of strong gales could not get up by sundown therefore boat did not go on shore.

Sunday June 14th All day strong gales from the NW and squally weather. Ship working up for the landing at Santa Cruz Flores for the liberty men. At 6 A.M. carried away foretop-sail by splitting it across the head rendering it useless for further use. At 10 split jibb all to ribbons unbent it and bent a new one. At 12 sent a boat on shore for the liberty men. At 1 1/2 P.M. boat returned with six of the watch absent all without leave. Their names are as follows Andrew Lewis Boatsteer, Eugene J. Gore, Alenat, Antonio Fox Lawrence, & Robert Charley. All these have no doubt deserted as they have not been seen today and all but Antonio Fox Lawrence were seen day before yesterday seen going up in the mountains. Antonio Fox Lawrence has no doubt been secreted by his father as he would give no account of him today when the 3d mate visited his house for that purpose. Two others Lawrence Antonio & Manuel Pedro are both on shore, Pedro being unwell and Lawrence supposed asleep in some house as when last seen was well intoxicated. The last two are supposed not to be deserters. At six P.M. wind more to the E and more moderate. Am. Bk. Kate Williams 14 days from Boston is going off and on discharging passengers and freight. Recd. one letter from Swift & Perry and two or three papers.
