

Barque Pacific Cruising In The

Monday Sept. 28th All day moderate breeze from the S.W. and fine pleasant weather - ship steering to the S.E. with all sail set - nothing in sight all day.

Tuesday Sept. 29th All day moderate breeze from the S.W. and cloudy weather - ship steering S.E. per compass for the Isle of Madeira - nothing in sight all day, but two sail steering to the S.W.

Wednesday Sept. 30th All day strong breeze from the S.W. and accompanied with rain and fog. Ship steering to the S.E. - at 8 A.M. raised the Isle of Madeira - at 6 P.M. abreast of the West end - all night lying off and on.

Thursday Sept. Oct 1st All day light breeze from the S.W. and fine pleasant weather. Ship lying off and on at Funchal Isle of Madeira - left Funchal at 5 P.M. came on board - lay off the Port until 9 - sold a lot of Tobacco - steered off for the Isle of Teneriffe with all prudent sail out - One Am. Bk. lying off the Port of Funchal.

Friday Oct. 2^d - All day steering for Teneriffe with a strong trade wind from S.W. - saw several sail - at 2 P.M. abreast and saw the Salvages - at 1 A.M. raised the light of Teneriffe.

Saturday Oct. 3^d All day fresh breeze from the S.W. and fine weather with some clouds - at 10 A.M. came to an anchor off the Dawn of Santa Cruz, Isle of Teneriffe in 13 fathoms of water with Starb. anchor 1/2 mile from Breakwater.

South Atlantic Ocean In the Year of 1874

Sunday Oct. 4th All this day fine pleasant weather with light winds from the S.W. - One watch on that part of it of the original crew on shore on liberty until resumed. Remainder of the crew enjoying the sabbath on board - at dusk all on board tried the Steward & John Green.

Monday Oct. 5th All day fresh breezes or trades from the S.E. and fine weather - ship at anchor at Santa Cruz, Teneriffe. The Original crew of Starb. Watch on liberty - all but Green of the Starboard Watch came on board last night - at dusk all of the Starb. Watch came on board but Joaquin Cantonio and Kanaka Charlie - Green coming on board with the Starb. Watch. The other two holding desisted taking water from the Water Boat - One Sound today 200 Bbls.

Tuesday Oct. 6th All day fresh breezes from the S.W. and clear weather - Took from the Water Boat today about 260 bbls. of water - at 4 P.M. got underweigh and stood out into the passage, all hands on board but the two deserters - offered \$15 each reward for their apprehension - Stowed anchors & chains & stood out S.W. per compass - at 10 P.M. abreast of South end of the Isle of Teneriffe.

Wednesday Oct. 7th All day strong trades from the S.W. and somewhat cloudy weather - ship steering S.W. by S with all sail out - put up a small square jib for a foretopmast studdensail - watch employed about ship - sent Lawrence & Antonio forward out of Stern-aye as he is not able to steer a boat, having been off duty since leaving the Alvaris Ground, sat about the 1st of Aug. Have no one suitable to steer a boat and think of touching at Brava for the purpose of obtaining a boatswain. Remainder of the crew are all well & all told. Nothing in sight all day - but a few birds. - Left at West 2 A.M. 12th
