Saturday Jan 16th First part fresh breeze from the S.W. and clear weather Ship by the wind to the W with all sail out in lee with the boom, Morris - On other whales in sight to the leeward - in Green water all day - No indications of whales - Just at night took a fresh breeze from N.W. kept ship to S.W. with nothing but topsails on the lee in lee.

Lat. 37 10 Long 52.05

Sunday Jan 17th All day strong breezes from the N.W. and quite fine weather with a heavy swell running from the S.W. - Ship by the wind to the S.E. with all prudent sail out - cruising in lee with the boom, Morris - Nothing in sight all day - water Green

Lat 38.10 Long 53.04

Monday Jan 18th All day strong breezes from the N.W. with quite fine weather - Ship in the N.W. steering S.E. by compass in the P.M. steering to with all prudent sail out - a heavy swell, setting in from S.W. - cruising in lee with the boom, Morris - all at M. in Green water - at 3 P.M. got into good blue - nothing indicating whales - saw small white water twice took it for Grampus

Lat 39 05 Long 53.05

Tuesday Jan 19th All day fine weather with light baffling winds from the S. Ship by the wind to the E until 4 P.M. when striking colored water tacked ship - One sail a merchantman in sight steering to the S.S.W. - saw quite a number of finbacks in the Green water - Bk. boom, Morris in lee.

Lat 38 43 Long 53.00

Wednesday Jan 20th First part calm Bk boom, Morris in lee, left W. on board and at 10 P.M. Baker on board the E.M. for a gun - In P.M. a light breeze from N.W. steering S.W. with all sail set - Nothing in sight Lat 38 37 Long 52.30

## Atlantic Ocean In The Year of 1875

Thursday Jan 21st All day fresh breezes from the W and overcast - Ship steering to the S in lee with boom, Morris for the ground of Lat 41 00 Long 51.00 Nothing in sight all day but Green Water

Lat 39.29 Long 52.20

Friday Jan 22nd All day strong gales from the N.W. and overcast with very poor sailing Ship cruising in lee with boom, Morris on different tacks - Nothing in sight but finbacks & all baron water Green nearly all day

Lat 40 55 Long 51.50

Saturday Jan 23rd All day light baffling winds from the W and N.W. Ship by the wind, sometimes with all sail out and then under double reefes, the winds blowing very unsteady with some rain and thick weather until 3 P.M. when it clears up and comes out fine weather

Lat 41 50 Long 53.27

Sunday Jan 24th All day moderate breezes from N.W. W. & S.W. with clear pleasant weather - Ship in the N.W. by the wind to the W on starboard tack - water clear of a milky blue - saw but a few birds and two or three sunfish - at 4 P.M. tacked ship being in rather Green water and as we judge in on the edge of the banks - as the wind hauled to the S.W. kept ship N. per compass - nothing more in sight

Lat 41.50 Long 53.45 W

Monday Jan 25th First part light airs from the N.W. and fine pleasant weather - Ship by the wind to the N.W. le. wind changed at 10 then tacked to the W. and at 12 tacked to E again - the water all the A.M. of a milky green - at noon quite blue - saw a few birds and one sunfish

Lat 41.09 Long 53.40
