

Barque Pacific Cruising In The North Atlantic Ocean In The Year of 1875

Saturday March 27th All day fresh breezes from the N.E. and somewhat cloudy weather - Ship by the wind to the N.W. with all prudent sail out - water blue and clear with a number of Portuguese Man of war and plenty of flying fish - Nothing more in sight all day.
Lat 6.58 Long 39.40

Sunday March 28th All day fresh E trades and quite fine weather - Ship by the wind to the N.W. with all prudent sail out - saw plenty of flying fish and some Portuguese Man of war - Nothing more in sight all day.
Lat 8.53 Long 40.44

Monday March 29th All day fine clear weather with the trades from E, N.E. and strong - Ship by the wind to the N.E. with all sail but fore top. Gaff sails and light staysails - One sail in sight steering to the N.E. - Saw many flying fish - water rather green - Spoke 13k A.M. Chelker Baker of N.B. with 100 lbs sperm - 4 mos Lat 11.02 Long 41.38

Tuesday March 30th All day fine weather and strong breezes from the E. - Ship by the wind cruising - saw two sail both steering to the N.E. - Nothing in sight indicating whales - Some flying fish - water rather green Lat 12.30 Long 42.14

Wednesday March 31st All day strong breezes from the E & N.E. and somewhat squally weather - Ship steering to the N.W. with all sail out - two sail in sight both steering to the N. - No indications of whales - water blue & clear - with nothing but flying fish Lat 14.10 Long 43.16

Thursday March April 1st All day baffling winds from the E & S.E. & cloudy weather - Ship steering to the N.W. with all sail out - One sail in sight - water blue & clear - with a few flying fish - Nothing more in sight Lat 16.49 Long 43.18

Friday April 2d All day moderate breezes from the South & cloudy weather - Ship steering N per comp. with all sail out - Two sail in sight both to the W. - water blue & clear - but very few flying fish - nothing more in sight - no birds, porpoises or fish of any kind.
Lat 18.49 Long 44.02

Saturday April 3d All day light baffling winds from the S, S.W. & W. and cloudy weather - Ship steering N.W. with all sail out - Nothing in sight all day but one sail bound to the W. - water blue & clear all day.
Lat 20.21 Long 44.48

Sunday April 4th All day moderate breezes from the S & S.W. & cloudy weather after a calm lasting all night - In the morning two sail in sight both steering to the W. under easy sail - In the E.M. saw conefish & Dolphin & two or three pieces of Gulf weed also one bird. Spoke a Spanish Bark 30 days from loading for Havana with wine Lat 20.21 Long 45.00

Monday April 5th All day light moderate winds from the South & S.E. and quite fine weather - Ship steering N.W. with all sail out - 2 sail in sight all steering to the W. - water blue with some fine jelly and animalcula. also a few small pieces of Gulf weed & two or three birds - Nothing more in sight all day.
Lat 22.48 Long 46.30

Tuesday April 6th All day light baffling winds from the South and fine clear warm weather - Ship steering to the N.W. with all sail out. Saw several sail steering to the W. - Saw large quantities of Gulf weed and two or three long tailed birds - Nothing more in sight all day.
Lat 23.40 Long 47.10
