

Bark Pacific Cruising In The North

Monday July 19th all day moderate breezes from the N. and quite good weather for whaling still somewhat overcast. Ship standing to the E all the A.M. with all prudent sail out in Sea with leam, Morris. In the P.M. to the W. N. W. Throughout the day saw several finbacks, Humpbacks & Sulphur Bottoms & several schools of porpoises. Water Green all day.

Lat. 49 09 Long 22.00

Tuesday July 20th comes in with fresh breezes and overcast from the N. and hauling to the W. Ship by the wind to the W. with all prudent sail out in Sea with leam, Morris until 10 A.M. then steered S until 12 then S. E. at 11 1/2 came in rainy with thick weather. Water Green until 12 then blue.

Wednesday July 21st comes in with moderate breezes from the N. E. and hazy weather. Ship cruising on various courses but working to the S. W. mostly in leam, Morris. In the P.M. saw her manoeuvring as though she saw whales. Towards night comes in foggy. Water rather Green all day. Saw one sail steering to the E. Water

Thursday July 22d All day foggy by spells with moderate breezes from the N. but poor seeing. Ship on different courses through the day in Sea with leam, Morris. Saw several finbacks & Humpbacks and at 3 1/2 raised Sperm Whales by leapt. from the deck several whales going South. quite foggy at the time cleared away and lowered all four W. boats and chand. at 5 P.M. saw Boat Mr. Brownell struck & badly stove. But no one hurt. soon got the Stoven Boat on board and at 7 took the whale alongside. judge he will make 80 bbls. got all ready for cutting and sent all hands but two below for the night

Atlantic Ocean In The Year of 1875

Friday July 23d all day fresh breezes from the N. and overcast with some fog. at 4 A.M. hooked on to the whale and commenced cutting. saw leam. close by cruising. also saw one sail bound E and a Steamer that came close to us. bound W. she evidently mistook us for a vessel in distress. at 12 finished cutting. In the P.M. made sail. cleared away Head and started the works. the weather in the P.M. rather better than in the A.M. water all day quite blue

Saturday July 24th All day fine weather with moderate breezes from the N. water rather Green. Ship cruising on different tacks. leam Morris in sight also cruising. saw a few finbacks. employed in building; the whale being rather poor, yielding but little oil

Lat. 49.08 Long 24.55

Sunday July 25th all day light airs and calm. Ship in Green water all day working to the S. W. mostly. leam, Morris in sight. at 4 Spoke her had struck a large whale and lost him the same day we took ours. was obliged to cut.

Lat. 49 03 Long 24.23

Monday July 26th All day strong breezes from the S. E. with cloudy weather & looking like rain. Ship all the A.M. cruising to the E with all prudent sail but cruising in Sea with leam Morris. Saw nothing all day indicating whales. all day water Green. employed in stowing oil in main hold. put down 83 bbls from last whale. In the P.M. standing to the W.

Lat 49.11 Long 23.00

Tuesday July 27th all day strong breezes from the S and hazy weather. Ship cruising on different tacks. no blue water but a few birds & porpoises but one or two finbacks. no Dead Stools or other indications of whales
