

Barge Pacific Cruising In the North

Friday Oct. 29th all day moderate breezes from the S. and fine pleasant weather. Ship by the wind to the S. S. E. with all prudent sail out. Cruising - saw several sail one finback and one humpback. One school of small fish. Water blue and clear.
Lat 35.15 Long. 19.10

Saturday Oct. 30th all day moderate wind from the West N.W. and somewhat squally weather. Ship steering S. S. E. with all sail out. Nothing in sight but sails and one or two finbacks. One sail a Barge we call a whaler steering S. S. E. like ourselves for Teneriffe. Water blue and clear.
Lat. 34.20 Long. 15.40

Sunday Oct. 31 all day light baffling winds from all points and calms. Ship steering S per compass with all sail out. Several sail in sight steering to the S.W. - saw several finbacks and one school of Grampuses. at 4 P.M. raised the Isle of Madeira bearing S. E. Dist 60 miles

Monday Nov. 1st all day light baffling winds from S to E. Ship steering S per compass. Several sail in sight steering to the S.W. - saw two finbacks and also the Isle of Madeira bearing at 12 M. E per compass Dist 35 miles. Water employed in breaking out and repairing. Ground two casks preparatory for water at Teneriffe.

Tuesday Nov. 2d all day light air from the S and S.W. and fine pleasant weather. Ship by the wind to the S. E. with all prudent sail out. with stowing coals in the lower hold for water. Madeira West end bearing N. Dist 10 miles at M. water blue and clear - saw one humpback.

Atlantic Ocean in the year of 1875

Wednesday Nov. 3d all day light air and calm air from N.W. at 6 P.M. took a breeze from N.E. Ship steering S by W. for Teneriffe - saw one sail under the lee of Madeira steering to the S. E. - nothing more in sight all day - Madeira bearing N. W. end. Dist 35 miles

Thursday Nov. 4th all day moderate breezes from N.E. and fine weather but rather smoky horizon. Ship steering S by W. with all sail out for the Isle of Teneriffe. at 4 P.M. judged ourselves up with the Salvages but did not see them the weather being smoky.

Friday Nov. 5th came in with moderate breezes from N.E. and fine weather. at 3 A.M. raised land on our lee bow. being the lee end of the Isle of Teneriffe. Current being very strong to the W. wore ship, heading off shore and commenced beating to the windward and continued working up all day. - so ends

Saturday Nov. 6th all day strong trades from N.E. and clear weather but rather smoky horizon. Ship working up on the N side of Teneriffe for the Port of Sta Cruz, on the E side. at 4 P.M. arrived off the E end and at dusk came to an anchor after taking on board or alongside a Pilot in 15 fathoms of water with best of Sta Cruz anchor. - found lying off and on, Bk. Lancer, Davidson of N.B. and Bk. Seine White of do at anchor.

Wednesday Nov. 10th all day fine pleasant weather with moderate N.E. trades. at San-Seion Bk Seine got underweigh and stood out to the S. at 9 P.M. got underweigh ourselves and stood out to the S. with light air. Spartan getting underway at the same time. We have painted ship and took on board small stores and about 450 casks of water at this place. Have also set up standing rigging fore and aft throughout the ship.
