Atlantic Ocean in the year of 1876

Tuesday June 20th comes in with strong gale
 from the N and cloudy weather - Ship steering N. E per
 compass with all sail out. - One sail in sight steering
 E. - in the P. M. saw two humpbacks - water
 rather green all day. Saw also two schools of porpoises
 Lat. 41 26 Long 39.50 W

Wednesday June 21st comes in with a
 gale from N. W. and thick overcast weather - Ship steering E by N.
 all day - three sail in sight steering to the E and one steering
 to the W. - water blue and clear. saw one school of por-
 poises one sunfish and several birds
 Lat. 42.45 Long 38.50

Thursday June 22d comes in with strong gale
 from the W and thick foggy weather - Ship steering E by N
 with all sail but Gaff Topsails out - water blue and
 clear - saw one sunfish and several birds - three sail
 in sight all steering to the E. - nothing indicating whales
 seen in through the day.
 Lat. 44.10 W Long 32.44 W

Friday June 23d comes in with light airs
 from E and S. E. and calms. - Ship steering E per compass
 with all sail out. for the beam, Morris Ground. In the
 morn. there were eleven sails in sight. Some bound W. and
 others to the E. - saw one large sunfish - one school of
 albacore, one school of porpoises, and several finbacks, at
 11 A. M. took a breeze from the W. - Water in the morn.
 rather green, in the P. M. rather red.
 Lat. at merid 45.04 Long 30.00

Saturday June 24th comes in with fresh gale
 from the W. and thick foggy weather - Ship steering to the E by N.
 with all prudent sail out. - 16 sails in sight at 12 M. all
 steering to the E - Water changeable. blue and green alternate-
 ly - Saw several flocks of birds one sunfish and two hump-
 backs and one finback In the P. M. wind to the W. W.
 with lifting fog. No more indications of whales
 Lat. 46.33 N. Long 27.10 W
