

Bark Pacific cruising in the

Friday July 14th comes in with light baffling winds from N.E. and thick foggy weather ship by the wind to the N.W. with small sail out. at 7 A.M. saw White Water on sea quarter, which proved to be a Grampus. Made sail and kept ship to N.E. but wind left us and we were becalmed from 9 to 11 A.M. Then took a light breeze from S.E. - somewhat hazy all day. - Water a good blue with some Sound Stools in the morn. - Saw some albacore and two sunfish. Lat. 46.40 Long 26.06

Saturday July 15th comes in with light airs and calm. Ship all the A.M. lying about still in the P.M. a light breeze from the S.W. - fine pleasant weather all day. - Water rather green. Saw several schools of square-headed Grampuses and several schools of porpoises, all going to the S.W. - One sail in sight steering to the S. - No indication of whales. Lat 46.39 N Long 25.36

Sunday July 16th comes in with light airs from S.W. and calm. Ship working to the N. with all sail out. Water rather green all day - in the morn 14 sails in sight, all steering to the S. Signalled two in the A.M. One giving us Long 26.55 W. and the other 26.10 W. while out, was 25.45 W. - Saw through the day several schools of Grampuses and one do of porpoise all working to the S.W. - Some few Sound Stools but are all faded out, white. We have seen considerable many of them the last few days but of them looking fresh and good. The birds have left us - only two seen today. Lat. 46.50 Long 25.45

North Atlantic Ocean in 1876

Monday July 17th comes in with light airs and calm 2 days from the South. Water in the A.M. rather green - Saw several schools of Grampuses and several do of porpoise all going to the S. - Several sail in sight all going to the S. - Signalled a Swedish Barkentine who gave us Long 26.05 W. - Watch employed in specking Starboard cable. In P.M. water somewhat blue but no indications of whales. Lat. 46.38 Long 46.10

Tuesday July 18th comes in with moderate breezes from S.P.W. and fine weather. Ship by the wind to the W. with all sail out cruising. - Water somewhat green, saw two schools of porpoises. - One sail in sight steering to the S. - Watch employed in cleaning Starboard cable, the starboard, one was changed yesterday. No Soundstool birds or other indications of whales. Lat. 46 03 Long 28.10

Wednesday July 19th comes in with light winds from S. and overcast. Ship by the wind to the W. with all sail out cruising. - at 10 A.M. wind changed to the N.W. with a light spitting of rain. - Ship heading to the S.W. per compass. - Saw in the A.M. some Soundstools. - water blue. - One sail a merchantman in sight steering to the S. - spoke Bk Ohio. Nothing since we - Lat. 45.34 Long 29.35

Thursday July 20th comes in with light winds from the N. and fine pleasant weather. Bk Ohio in lee, both steering to the S and W. with all sail out. - water blue with number of Soundstools and jellies. - Saw one school of porpoises and one hump back. - at 10 1/2 Ohio had bout down for Grampuses as proved. - lowered all of ours and chased until 12 P.M.
