Tuesday December 20th 1842

All these 24 hours strong breezes from southward with over cast weather with all sail set steering E & E at 4 P M spoke the ship munched of hovey saw several fine backs and

Sat 44 = 00 S
Long 126 = 24 E

Wednesday Dec 21st 1842

These 24 hours commences with strong breeze from southward steering E & E with all set latter saw whales lower but all in vain first part repaired the foresail and bent it latter mind hals to the westward over cast meat.



Sat 45 = 00 S
Long 126 = 24 E

Thursday Dec 22^d

All these 24 hours strong breezes from N B W with over cast weather steering S B & E at 9 P M took in the main top gallant sail and double reefed the fore top sail latter more moderate all sail set so end broke out the after hal for water

Sat 45 = 00 S
Long 126 = 24 E

Friday Dec 23^d

These 24 hours commences with fresh gales from N B W steering E & E with all sail set over cast weather at 1 P M saw whales but to rugged to lower shortened sail and luff the ship to the wind heading N W under close reefed top sails at 6 P M were ship heading S B & E at 4 square the yards and keep her away east under easy sail latter all sail set so end.



Sat 45 = 20 S
Long 139 = 11 E

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Saturday December 24th 1842

These 24 hours commences with fresh gales from southward and westward with all sail set over cast weather steering East latter moderate

Sat 45 = 28 S
Long 141 = 23 E

Sunday December 25th 1842

These 24 hours commences with light breeze from southward and westward with over cast weather steering east with all sail set middle and latter light airs and calms from westward and northward and westward so end steering E by S with all sail set

Sat 45 = 32 S
Long 143 = 33 E

Monday December 26th

All of these 24 hours light breezes from westward with over cast weather steering E with all sail set latter men employed repairing the main top sail so end the 24 hours

Sat 45 = 56 S
Long 146 = 31 E

Tuesday December 27th

These 24 hours commences with light airs from southward and westward with over cast weather steering E & E latter mind hals to the east ward at 4 P M caught a porpoise men employed repairing an old top sail at 11 P M saw a night whale lower the boats but all in vain seen

Sat 46 = 06 S
Long 149 = 06 E
