

Sunday June 26th 1846

First part light air from westward fine
in latter sun & breeze cooler but all in rain
at 2 P.M. spoke the williams homestead
last hole of new helpord 15 months ago latter
latter strong breezes from NW overcast
weather



Lat 54 = 23 W
Long 153 = 33 W

Monday June 27th

First part fresh gales from north westerly over-
cast weather latter more moderate sun & breeze
lower struck and killed one S B and sunk
her so ends



Lat 54 = 05 W
Long 153 = 31 W

Tuesday June 28th

These 24 hours strong breezes from east rain
over cast weather with squalls of rain at 3
P.M. saw 10 whale with 2 harpoons and a line
lower for him but all in vain latter under
double reef top sails sun nothing so ends



Lat 53 = 40 W
Long 153 = 44 W



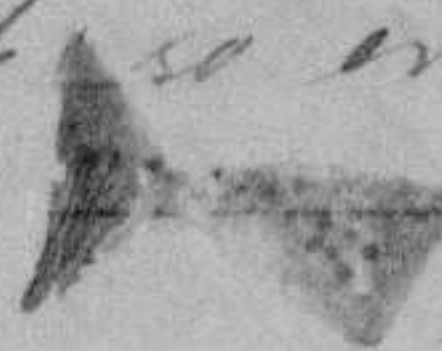
Wednesday June 29th 1846

These 24 hours fresh gale from NW over east
weather steering north and eastward under
double reef top. Sails so ends

Lat 54 = 28 W
Long 152 = 20 W

Thursday June 30th

These 24 hours strong breezes from westward
over east weather sun & breeze going quick to
the westward so ends



Lat 55 = 15 W
Long 151 = 39 W

Friday July 1st 1846

First part strong breezes from westward
over east weather steering northward at 4 P.M.
saw the large disdaming standing to the south
and eastward under easy. Sails latter light wind
from eastward thick foggy weather so ends
old Ols dead reckoning

Lat 55 = 28 W
Long 151 = 00 W

Saturday July 2nd

These 24 hours fresh gales from north and west
ward first foggy latter over east weather with
some rain at 8 P.M. spoke the ship from
of Sagrator 22 months ago last 1100 this year
so ends of gale from north lying to under
short sail

Lat 55 = 06 W
Long 150 = 38 W
