jib so ends this 24 hours

These 24 hours moderate trades and pleasant
weather steering south and eastward at 4 P M
it saw a shoal of sperm whales lower 4
boats struck and killed one S & B at 10 took
him along side and commence cutting so ends

Saturday Sept 23rd

These 24 hours variable winds and calms with
squalls of rain at 2 P M finished cutting ware
ship and make sail steering S & E S with all
sail set at 7 commence hoisting at 10 cook down
at 11 it commence hoisting again so ends

Lat 7 - 45

Long 153 - 09

Sunday Sept 24th

These 24 hours light variable winds and calms
steering S & E S rainy weather at 4 P M
commence hoisting at 9 cook down rainy
so ends rainy

Lat 7 - 30

Long 152 - 28

Monday Sept 25th

These 24 hours variable winds and calms with
squalls of rain at 1 P M saw a shoal of sperm
whales lower 3 boats and struck 4 whales and
saw 2 S & B and L & B at 7 took them along side
took in sail at 6 A M call all hands and
commence cutting at 10 finish ware ship and
make sail heading S & E S with all sail set
so ends hoisting Lat 7 - 25 Long 151 - 22
