

Honolulu Oahu Sandwich Islands

Tuesday Sept 26th 1845

First part light breezes and pleasant weather
employed boiling middle masting latter strong
breezes from S.E. fine weather so end

Lat 7° 19' N
Long 151° 20' W

Wednesday Sept 27th

These 24 hours strong breezes from S.E. pleasant
weather at 1 P.M. finished boiling and finished
making the flying jib at 2 P.M. bent the fly
jib so end

Lat 6° 19' N
Long 151° 20' W

Thursday Sept 28th 1845

These 24 hours strong breezes from S.E. with pleasant
weather employed at Ship's duty steering S.E. and
all drawing sail set so end

Lat 5° 00' N
Long 151° 54' W

Friday Sept 29th

These 24 hours moderate breezes from S.E. with
pleasant weather close hauled to the wind with
the larboard tack on board all sail set at 2 P.M.
saw several whales lower 8 boats but did not succeed
at 8 P.M. on board at 9 P.M. saw whales going quick
S.E. so end

Lat 4° 15' N
Long 152° 15' W

Towards the Belford W S H

Saturday Sept 30th 1845

These 24 hours pleasant gale S.E. and fine weather
first part finished repairing the old foresail at 4
P.M. bent the foresail and bent the old one at
5 P.M. commenced repairing the foresail at 11 finished
and stowed it below so end

Lat 3° 05' N
Long 153° 22' W

Sunday Oct 1st 1845

These 24 hours strong breezes from S.E. and
pleasant weather first part employed repairing
an old main top gallant sail saw nothing

Lat 2° 11' N
Long 154° 30' W

Monday Oct 2nd

These 24 hours strong breezes from S.E. pleasant
weather latter employed repairing an old
fore top sail so end steering S.E. and all sail set

Lat 00° 23' N
Long 154° 36' W

Tuesday Oct 3rd

These 24 hours strong breezes and pleasant
weather employed repairing an old top sail
steering about S. with all sail set so end

Lat 1° 45' N
Long 155° 30' W
