

Wednesday March 6th 1844.

These 24 hours commenced with strong breezes from N.W.
B. & S. and cold employed beating to the windward
at 4 P.M. took a pilot on board. Here bearing of
E. distant 2 leagues all hands employed beating to the
windward of the Son and Digs. at 5 P.M. got the weather
of them and shared our bores for dinner. Breeze light breeze
light air from N.W. and pleasant weather and cold. at 9 let
go the provisions in 6 lbs of water. light breeze bearing S.W.
distant 2 of a mile. after an absence of 18 months
and 20 days etc. 12 landed with my traps on Smith's ship
Fairbanks ~~to the same~~

After a long and tedious passage of 174 days from Cuba
Hondolo Sandwich Island. From Honolulu to Honolulu
8 days from Honolulu to Cape Horn 46 days from Cape Horn
to St. Katherine's 28. From St. Katherine's to Cape Horn
65 days 4 days staying at Anchor at St. Katherine's

Total 174 Days Passage

So Ends this voyage 6 day of March 1844
