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June 28th 1822 begins with light winds.
 From 8 AM and clear weather. At 1 PM got
 under way and stood out of the harbour.
 At 4 PM the wind shifted to S W by S
 backed and stood back. At 5 PM came to
 anchor above the light. At 11 PM got
 under way with the wind. And stood
 out of the harbour. At 7 AM discharged
 the Pilot Mr. Meridian, and then
 we began our distance from which I take
 my departure.

Sat
 June 29th 1822 all this 24 hours Pleasant
 & good weather. From 8 AM and clear weather. At 1 PM
 under full sail. But would drive
 the first part steering S by E. At 3 PM
 stood S by E. At 5 PM stood S by E.
 All hands employed flying boats and
 clearing decks. So ends this Day.
 Lat. 39° 48' North Long. 69° 23' West

Sunday June 30th 1822 begins with Pleasant good
 and clear weather. Steering S E under full sail.
 See a number of vessels standing to the east.
 See porpoises and some fish. At 3 PM took
 in the fore top & sail and flying jib and stood
 S by E. The latter part light winds and clear
 till the eve & sail and flying jib so ends this day.
 Lat. 39° 14' North Long. 63° 14' West
