

Journal of a whaling voyage from
Monday July 1st 1822 Commences with light
Winds from S & S. E. Sea very choppy and
crampy and second fish the middle light
Winds and squally with rain steering ESE
the latter part steering SE by E with the
jaws south and pleasant Sea. Humble
Sail So ends all hands employed fitting books
Lat 42° 39' North Long 66° 53' West

Tuesday July 2^d 1822 Wind light and
variable several sail in sight a heavy swell the
jaws SW and cloudy the middle the wind
shifted to NW of the latter part squally
with thunder and rain took in top sail
and letted down the main sail at 11 AM
the remainder of the day steering SE So ends
People employed fitting for whaling
Lat 40° 52' North Long 65° 31' West

Wednesday July 3^d 1822 begins with light winds
from S & S. E. and cloudy set the top sail
and flying jib at 8 AM Sea black fish
put off could not strike steering SE
to the SE from 8 AM to 6 PM when
took to breeze from SE stood to the SE
So ends all hands employed fitting for whaling
Lat 40° 15' North Long 64° 05' West

Thursday July 4th 1822 begins with light
winds from S & S. E. Sea choppy and choppy
the Schooner under all sail steering ESE
the middle fresh wind the latter part
squally and raining took in fore top sail
flying jib and humbled the main sail
Lat 41° 03' North Long 62° 44' W

Northward Towards the Coast of Africa

Friday July 5th 1822 begins with heavy
showers of rain at 2 PM set the sheets
out of the main sail and set the top
sail the latter steering ESE the middle
and latter part fresh wind So ends this
Lat 42° 51' North Long 60° 00' West

Saturday July 6th 1822 begins with fresh winds from
Northward from 9 AM at 1 PM Couland the water
sounded from the bottom the Schooner under
all sail steering East at 6 AM the wind shifted
to ESE steering with wind to SE the latter
part light winds and clear weather So ends
Lat 42° 24' North Long 58° 07' West

Sunday July 7th 1822 begins with a calm
and cloudy at 11 PM took to light breeze from
South steering East the Schooner under all
sail the latter part fresh wind took in flying
jib and took in the day
Lat 42° 39' North Long 57° 24' West

Monday July 8th 1822 begins with fresh winds
from cloudy Sea a breeze standing to the Eastward
the Schooner under all sail steering SESE
the middle and latter part light winds
and clear weather Sea green and choppy
So ends the day People employed fitting
Lat 42° 15' North Long 55° 22' West

Tuesday July 9th 1822 begins with the fresh winds
from ESE took in fore top sail double kept the
fore sail and 3 reefs in the main sail took
the bar at the side Couland the water in
being hot the dead end line the latter part
from Monstrous set the sheets out So ends this
Lat 41° 07' North Long 55° 00' West
Suppose we are on the 2^d of July
