

A Journal of a Voyage from Fairhaven

Wednesday July 10th 1822 begins with fresh
winds from E & S. Cloudy. At 6 P.M. Made
All sail. And I took a ship to the south
Easterly light winds through the night.
At 5 A.M. the S. & S. wind was heard.
Chased a couple of fish. Fresh winds
from S. & S. E. Clear weather.
Schooner in the sail steering SE
Left Oct 41 13 North Long 54 10 West

Thursday July 11th 1822 begins with fresh breeze
from West. Set the square sail and
goft top sail. The sun down. Squally but
in the light. Sail the better part
light winds. And clear weather. Steering
E. S. E. All this 24 hours
At 10 P.M. found our Long to be 49 08 30
By the Lunar Obs. By measuring the distance
of the Moon from the Sun
Left Oct 40 56 North Long 51 29 West

Friday July 12th 1822 All this 24 hours fresh
winds from W. S. & S. E. Clear weather. The S. &
under all sail. Steering S. E. S. W. Many
fish seen. And doing other jobs.
Left Oct 40 31 North Long 43 19 West
Long By the Lunar Obs. 46 04 30

Saturday July 13th 1822 begins with light winds. And
clear weather. The S. & S. under all sail. Steering
S. E. S. W. The middle and latter part
the fish were seen. This day
Left Oct 40 30 North Long 46 49 West
Long By the Lunar Obs. 44 03 30

Towards the East of Africa Whaling

Sunday July 14th 1822 begins with
calm. At 8 P.M. took a breeze from
S. & S. E. Made all sail. And steered S. E. S. E.
The middle and latter part fresh winds
And clear weather. Steering S. E. S. E. 50 miles
Left Oct 40 39 North Long 44 44 West
Long By the Lunar Obs. 43 18 West

Monday July 15th 1822 begins with fresh winds from
S. & S. E. Cloudy. The Schooner under all sail. And
blown sails. Steering S. E. by 8 P.M. S. E. S. E. The
latter part light. Set top sail. Top & sail. And goft
top sail. And began to sail. So much. Clear weather. And
steering S. E. S. E. All day. Long 40 44 15 West
Long By the Lunar Obs. 40 44 15 West

Tuesday July 16th 1822 All this 24 hours light
winds from S. & S. E. Clear weather. The
Schooner under all sail. Steering S. E. S. E.
The fish were seen. And doing other jobs.
Left Oct 39 41 North Long 39 29 West

Wednesday July 17th 1822 All this 24 hours light
winds from S. & S. E. Clear weather. The S. &
under all sail. That would have steering on a
line. So E. S. E. This day
Left Oct 38 21 North Long 38 19 West

Thursday July 18th 1822 begins with light winds from
S. & S. E. Clear weather. Steering S. E. S. E. The Schooner
under all sail. And chased them 4 hours
Could not come up with them. Clear weather
Made all sail. And steered S. E. S. E. 50 miles
Left Oct 37 38 North Long 38 08 West
