

Friday July 19th 1822 begins with light
from West and clear weather the Sch
under all sail steering East till 3 PM
back in sail then day heading to
N E wind to force sail through the light
At 4 AM Made all sail and stood to
the Eastward light wind from West
Latitude 37° 57' N Longitude 37° 08' West

Saturday July 20th 1822 All this day from
light winds from West then clear
weather the Sch under all sail
steering East Sea very much
Latitude 37° 57' N Longitude 36° 10' West

Sunday July 21st 1822 All this day from
winds from NW the Sch under all sail
steering SE the water part steady
So ends this day
Latitude 39° 10' N Longitude 33° 57' West

Monday July 22nd 1822 begins with light
from West the Sch under all
sail steering East then the Miller and
the part fresh wind At 4 AM
Made the Island of St. George bearing
E N E So ends this day Longitude 31° 52' West

Tuesday July 23rd 1822 Commences with
light winds from West clear weather
At 1 PM landed for paper and
got some fish and signs the ship
At 4 PM the water part got some
vegetation but it did not the Eastern

Wednesday July 24th 1822 begins with light
winds from West clear weather the Sch under
all sail steering E N E with the wind
from the SE by N day light the
fresh wind from the SE with the sun
At 10 AM Made sail and stood to E N E
So ends this day Latitude 39° 11' N Longitude 29° 24' West

Thursday July 25th 1822 All this day from
light winds from West clear weather
the Sch under all sail steering SE
St George bearing SE by S 5 leagues
At sundown shortened sail and
stood NW At midnight turned to SE
At day light Made all sail and stood
SE on St George So ends this day Longitude 28° 48' West

Friday July 26th 1822 All this day from
light winds from West clear weather the
Sch under all sail steering
off to the SE of St George and St George
Spoke the Sch Seven the Son of Boston
Cook & Men the water had nothing
Also bring a violent with the Sch
So ends this day Sea very much

Saturday July 27th 1822 All this day from
light winds from West clear weather
At 4 PM the Sch under all sail
steering off to the SE of St George
with the Sch So ends this day
