 light river is through the light to 4 P. M.
 North St. Marys bearing S S W to S. black the
 mountains rocks bearing S W E to the last
 of St. Marys so on South W. 36° 46' South

Wednesday August 14 41.822 to 41.834 having been
Winds from S. E. and clear with the S. E. wind
at 10.00 A.M. Steaming South. At 11.00 P.M. took in
