

Thursday August 15th 1822 till this 24 hours
Fresh winds from E & the Schooner all sail
steering South at 10 P.M. took in Top & Sail
and Square Sail at 4 P.M. let them go again
So Ends this day Lat 12° 31' North Long 17° 48' West

Friday August 16th 1822 commences with fresh winds
from E & E. And thick weather the Schooner under
all sail that would draw steering South by West
at 8 P.M. took in Top & Sail Square Sail and flying
jib fresh winds though the night latter part
Moderate Made all sail So Ends green weather
Lat 12° 30' North Long 17° 34' West

Saturday August 17th 1822 begins with light winds from
E & E. And clear weather Course South at 8 P.M. I shall
relate one thing that is enough to bring you on
gall at 5 P.M. see a large sperm whale some
Boat Boats and got within Boat length of him
and he went down We stayed till the Boat left
after Sun down went on board shortened sail
and went to windward though the night at 8 P.M.
steered W by S So Ends this day fresh winds from E & E
Lat 12° 20' North Long 17° 34' West

Sunday August 18th 1822 till this 24 hours fresh
winds from E & E. And hazy weather the Schooner
under all sail that would draw steering S by W
at Sun down took in sail and at 1 P.M. I shall
under top sail at daylight Made all sail
So Ends this day fresh winds and hazy weather
Lat 12° 53' North Long 17° 23' West

Monday August 19th 1822 till this 24 hours
Moderate winds from E & E. And hazy
weather this day fresh winds from E & E
steering S by W at 1 P.M. I shall under
Lat 12° 07' North Long 17° 37' West

Tuesday August 20th 1822 till this 24 hours
light winds and then with the Schooner
all sail steering S by W with the wind from
E & E Bunt taken from top sail So Ends
Lat 12° 00' North Long 17° 30' West

Wednesday August 21st 1822 begins with light winds
and clear with the Schooner all sail steering
S by W with the wind from E & E
under top sail and I shall at 1 P.M. Bunt
it again at 6 P.M. the wind shifted to
S by E stood S W on to wind at 6 P.M. took
in I stood to eastward So Ends Long by Sun
Lat 14° 42' North Long 17° 36' 42° 12' West

Thursday August 22nd 1822 till this 24 hours light
winds and light squalls of rain the first part
steering S by E with the South by at 8 P.M.
took in I stood to the west at 7 P.M. home
and stood S by E So Ends this day
Lat 14° 28' North Long 17° 46' West

Friday August 23rd 1822 begins with light winds and
variable from South steering East and wind the
Middle light winds from North steering
the latter part pleasant wind from West
the S. under all sail steering S by W
Sea for present I put back So Ends this day
Lat 13° 51' North Long 17° 52' West

Sat August 24th 1822 begins with light winds
from W by W under all sail steering S by W
the Middle fresh winds and heavy rains
the latter part light winds So Ends this
Lat 12° 07' North Long 18° 12' West
