

Wednesday Sept 4th 1822 begins with light winds
from SSW Course SEBS the Wind the same
the latter part cloudy and light rains
Sun Mary Porpoises So Ends this day 10th 12th
Lat 13° 20' North Long 100° 12' West

Thursday Sept 5th 1822 till this 24 hours
from SSW wind from SWS and cloudy the
S. h. and die till sail that would do and steering
SEBS So Ends this day
Lat 13° 50' North Long 100° 44' East

Friday Sept 6th 1822 till this 24 hours light winds
from SSW and clear weather the Sch under all
sail that would do and steering on to the
SE So Ends this day
Lat 13° 00' North Long 101° 11' East

Sat Sept 7th 1822 till this 24 hours pleasant breeze
from SSW and clear weather the Sch under all
sail steering SE for St Thomas Island Sun
Mary Porpoises kinds and small fish till 3 AM
back to Sun 04 and found the long to be
at 10 AM Made the land Island of St John
Bearing SE Distance 10 the South point - East
So Ends this day Lat 13° 00' North Long 101° 21'

Sunday Sept 8th 1822 begins with light winds
from WSW and clear weather the Sch under
all sail that would do and crossing off the
SW part of St Thomas Island the Wind
and latter part fresh wind and cloudy
Sun School of black fish and then would
get strike So Ends this day the Island bearing
SE 10 Miles distance

Monday Sept 9th 1822 begins with fresh winds from
WSW and clear weather the Sch under all sail
at 4 PM stood to the west North wind till midnight
backed and stood in for the Island the latter
part light winds and clear weather the Sch under
all sail the latter part of the Sch So Ends this day bearing
SW 6 leagues

Tuesday Sept 10th 1822 begins with fresh winds
from SSW the Sch under all sail standing
on to the South till 6 PM the latter part
St Thomas bearing WBS till 4 PM
backed to the west and the latter part light
winds and clear weather the Sch under all sail bearing
SW So Ends Lat 13° 00' North

Wednesday Sept 11th 1822 till this 24 hours light
winds from WSW the Island bearing West
till 2 PM went on shore and got some coconuts
on the SE part of the Island and so in habitants
back to the South west by through the night
trying to go to the South west of the Island found
the current setting SW So steering that we could
not get around till 5 AM then we set the Sch under
all sail back to the Sch at 10 AM bearing SW 6
Miles distance when we saw one ship one brig and
a number of small vessels So Ends this day

Thursday Sept 12th 1822 begins with light winds from
SE and clear weather the Sch under all sail
steering South till 2 PM then W till 3 PM the
Wind from SSW the latter part of St Thomas Island
bearing SE till 4 PM stood in shore on to the
till 6 PM backed and stood off So Ends this day

Friday Sept 13th 1822 begins with light winds from
WSW and clear weather the Sch under all sail
SSW 3 leagues to the Sch under all sail
standing off shore on to the South till 2 PM stood
for black fish could not strike light winds
though the light till daylight backed then I stood
in shore till 3 PM black fish found then
got on till 10 PM and again then I got 2
So Ends this day
