

Sat Sept 14th 1822 till this 24 hours light
Winds from S W then W then with the Schooner
sailed till sail passing off the shore then on
St Thomas took the break being 50 miles
10 leagues out to the S. W. Sea San Juan Is. 10 leagues

Sunday Sept 13 # 7822 Within 24 hours from which
from S W the first part Employed Boiling Black
fish oil the Middle thick Kneads the Sather part
When the heat peaks on the Ish burning till
the Schimmer under the sail Boating up towards
the west part of the Ish 30 Ends this day Sat the 14th 1828

Monday Sept 16th 1812 All this 24 hours Light winds
and Clear weather the Schooner under full sail
Beating up to the Westward of the Island with the
Wind S.W. the West point Bearing S.W.
So Ends this day See nothing

Tuesday Sept 17th 1822 begins with light winds from
S.W. and clear weather. The Sch. under the full sail beating
to windward till 8 P.M. Sun shales down then I closed
sails & at 10 o'clock the Sch. struck the 6 P.M. down & again struck down
but I killed her back her along side & put the
cable and hawsers on her till 8 P.M. set her back
at 8 P.M. and all hands at 6 P.M. began to cut
at & finished cutting at 11 P.M. the full sail
S.E. - so that this day -

Wednesday Sept 10th 1852. All this 24 hours fresh
Breeze from S.W. the schooner still
beating to windward. At 3 P.M. Breeze
at 11 A.M. finished Beiling Island this

Thursday Sept 19th 1822 B. thin & calm
Light wind from Clear ice at the Larkum Pk.
So. Cur as the Richard Bearing S.E.

Friday Sept 20th 1822 P.M. this 24 hours light
winds from S.W. & fair weather
the S.W. wind again in full sail beating
up to windward of the Island So on 4

Sat Sept 20th 1822 till this 24 hours Light winds from
S W and Clear weather the first part of the day
the oil which was 15 bbls to 22 gals
the Schooner made full Sail Beating to wind
ward the Island Bearing S E 20 Miles Distance
So ends this voyage Strong Current to the East

Sunday Sept 22 1822 till this 24 hours Light M. Ste. I
Came with the Schooner under Full Sail Stand-
ing off shore with wind the South East
Standing to the South East wind Spoke Big
Murenas So Ends the Island of Peales Bearing
East Distance 10 Miles

Monday Sept 23^d 1822 begins with light winds
from S.W. then clear weather went on shore to
Sticks Island. On 24th got some fruit etc to S.M.
got an bear killed to feed H. on board
the latter part light winds see humph
Baker Islands, the Peak of St. Thomas,
Bearing E.S. the Bright Island

Foundry Sept 24 # 1922 All this 4 hours Light
 breeze S W then I then weather the ship
 under the sail standing on to win I 20 W
 to S W W Tacked the 25th in the
 forenoon the first break Bow S E Dist 55 miles
 So ends this day

Wednesday Sept 25th 1822 the first boat light
for I cleared with the Schooner at Sail
steering on a bearing to the South East Sail
to seaward the latter part of the
wind to 6 P.M. Fair and good stood off shore
to land this day the South part of the Island
bearing S E by E Dist 14 Miles Sea to land to seaward

Thursday Sept 26 #1922 All this morning light
Windy. Clear weather. The S. L. Steamer left
Sail Cannoning off to the Western End of St. John
the North point the Island becoming dark.
