

Tuesday November 4th 1822 the first part clear weather
on boat flying jib then it thund. Bunt it again
Spoke the Schooner with 60 barrels at 4 P.M.
Raising the Middle tree Satter part clear weather
Schooner under all sail Cruising off the NW
part of St Thomas So Ends this day Mending old
Sb. So Ends this day

Wednesday November 5th 1822 All this 24 hours light
Windy from SW then clear weather the Schooner
all sail standing in from the land till
hands, carp (wage) Mending the old Main sail
So Ends the day Bering SSE Dist 10 Miles

Thursday November 6th 1822 begins with light
Windy then clear weather Land till 5 o'clock
Saw for first the Middle clear weather
the Satter part fresh windward and cloudy
Sailed the land SE 20 Miles Dist

Friday November 7th 1822 All this 24 hours
fresh windward clear weather the Schooner
all sail Cruising off the NW of St Thomas

Saturday November 8th 1822 commences with light
Windy from SW then thick raining weather
the Middle calm and clear the Satter part
light wind in then clear Bunt the old Main
sail So ends this day the North point
Bearing SSE Dist 15 Miles

Sunday November 9th 1822 the first part of this
light windy from SW and clear weather the
Middle calm the Satter part light wind from SW
the Schooner all sail standing west So ends this

Monday November 10th 1822 begins with fresh winds
from SW and clear weather the Schooner
all sail standing on a wind to the westward
at 5 P.M. Tacks and Standing in from the land the Satter
part light wind the Blackbird and finbacks So ends

This happens between two days this Picking letters
to send home by the Brig Mercuria of St. Kitts
Daniel Wood Master

Tuesday November 11th 1822 All this 24 hours light
Windy and clear weather the Schooner all sail
standing in from the land till 5 P.M. to seaward
at 5 P.M. Tacks and Standing in from the westward

So Ends this day the land Bearing SW 10 miles Dist
Wednesday November 12th 1822 All this 24 hours fresh
Windy from SW and clear weather the Schooner all sail
beating up to the west End of the Island the Middle
Bearing South the Current being strong to the
Westward the two sails windward So Ends this

Thursday November 13th 1822 All this 24 hours fresh
Windy from SW and clear weather the Schooner
all sail Cruising off the NW part of the Island
Bunt the jib stay and 1300 Spunk Schooner
Bled them again and set them up So Ends this

Friday November 14th 1822 All this 24 hours fresh
Windy from SW the Schooner all sail Cruising
off the NW part of St Thomas Island the
Blackbird and finbacks So Ends this day

Saturday November 15th 1822 All this 24 hours fresh
Windy from SW and clear weather the Schooner
all sail Cruising off the north part of the
Island Dist from the land from 5 to 10 Miles

Sunday November 16th 1822 All this 24 hours fresh
Windy from SW and clear weather the Schooner
under all sail Cruising for whaler the Island
of St Thomas Bearing SSE Dist from 5 to 10
Miles on sail to seaward and into windward

Monday November 17th 1822 All this 24 hours fresh winds
from SW and clear weather the Schooner all sail
beating to windward the Blackbird Bearing SSE 10 Miles

Tuesday November 18th 1822 All this 24 hours light
Windy and clear weather the Schooner under all
sail beating up to the North part of the Island
the Blackbird Bearing SSE Dist 10 Miles
