

Wednesday November 20th 1822 begins with light winds and
raining at 5 P.M. the wind shifted to S.W. at 8 P.M. light
the wind shifted to S.W. the latter part light
wind and clear with the peak bearing East Dist 20 miles

Thursday November 21st 1822 All this 24 hours light winds
and clear with the Sch under all sail. Cruising
of the West part of the Island Dist from 2 to 24 Miles

Friday November 22nd 1822 All this 24 hours light
winds and clear with the Sch under all sail. Many
black fish and Charrs taken. Could not strike
the Island bearing East from 2 to 30 Miles Dist

Saturday November 23rd 1822 begins with light winds and
clear weather the Sch under all sail standing to the
north at 10 o'clock took in all sail light winds through
night the latter part thick weather and raining. So ends

Sunday November 24th 1822 begins with light winds and raining
the middle the same the latter part fresh winds and clear
with the Sch under all sail the Island S.E. 14 Miles

Monday November 25th 1822 the first part of the fresh winds and
clear with the Sch under all sail standing in
for the land the middle and latter light winds
and clear with the Island S.E. 13 Miles

Tuesday November 26th 1822 All this light winds and
clear weather on the main top and main did it and
bent it again the Island bearing South 20 Miles

Wednesday November 27th 1822 All this light winds and
clear with the Sch plenty black fish the Sch
under all sail Cruising off the West part of the Island

Thursday November 28th 1822 the first part light
winds and clear with the Sch under all sail
Cruising up to the north part of the Island
the middle the same the latter part fresh winds
and clear with the Island S.E. Dist 10 miles

Friday November 29th 1822 begins with thick
raining with the Sch under all sail and lightning
the latter part light winds and clear
with the Island S.E. 14 Miles

Saturday November 30th 1822 All this 24 hours light
winds and clear with the Sch bearing South
from 14 to 35 Miles Dist

Sunday December 1st 1822 All this 24 hours light winds
and clear with the Sch under all sail bearing South
and landed at about 10 o'clock for fresh got down
the latter part under all sail standing off shore
to the north of the Island S.E. 13 Miles

Monday December 2nd 1822 All this 24 hours light winds and
clear with the Sch under all sail and
a wind to the West at 6 P.M. Tacked and stood in for
at 11 A.M. Sea fresh to South the Island 40 miles S.E.

Tuesday 3rd 1822 All this 24 hours light winds and clear with
the Island South from 20 to 6 Miles S.E. ends this day

Wednesday 4th 1822 All this 24 hours light winds and clear
with the Sch under all sail the Island South 20 miles

Thursday December 5th 1822 All this 24 hours light
winds and clear with the Sch under
all sail bearing off for the West part
of the Island the Island South 18 Miles

Friday Dec 6th 1822 All this day light winds and clear
with the Sch under all sail bearing to the west
the Island South 20 Miles Dist

Saturday Dec 7th 1822 All this day light winds and clear
with the Sch the Island bearing to the west
the Island S.E. 15 Miles Dist

Sunday Dec 8th 1822 begins with fresh winds and cloudy
the middle raining at 11 A.M. the wind shifted to S.W. and
sprung with heavy rains took in all sail so ends this

Monday December 9th 1822 begins with fresh winds and cloudy
night all sail and stood in for the land with the wind S.W.
the latter part raining the wind S.W. 16 Miles

Tuesday Dec 10th 1822 All this 24 hours light winds from
S.W. and clear with the Island S.E. from 25 to 45 Miles

Wednesday December 11th 1822 All this 24 hours light winds
and clear with the Sch under all sail bearing South
of Boston 8 o'clock out with 12 o'clock at 1 o'clock the
Day the Island S.E. 14 Miles

Thursday Dec 12th 1822 All this 24 hours light winds and
clear with the Sch under all sail off the north part
of the Island the first part landed at about 10 o'clock
and got some fresh at 11 A.M. the Sch under all sail
then part of our flying jib, boom and main did it
the latter part fresh and it again and set the Sch
to South the Island South 20 Miles

Friday Dec 13th 1822 All this 24 hours light winds and clear with
the Sch under all sail standing off the latter part the
Island S.E. Dist from 2 to 24 Miles
