

Sat Oct 13th 1827 Begins with fresh winds from S & S. Squally the ship saying by under four sails and main top sail heading ESE at 4 P.M. more ship set close reefed top sails and steered WSW at 9 A.M. Spoke ship Hamble Green of Sagharbaun 43.03 the latter part light winds the ship under all sail steering of West 3 ships in sight finished Boil. Lat Ob^d 38.22 South Long 47.00 West

Sunday Oct 14th 1827 Begins with light winds from S & the ship under all sail steering to the westward the shipback the spoke ship. An hour of hammer at sundown double reefed the top sail and steered West through the light at daylight made all sail at 10 A.M. See whales some I struck one the iron on and I see a plenty of whales so ends. Lat Ob^d 38.15 South Long 47.00 By Loran 43.44

Monday Oct 15th 1827 Begins with light winds from S & S and clear weather the ship under all sail see a great number of whales struck one after sundown cut the line down on board and took in sail fresh wind though the light at daylight made sail see a plenty of whales I have I could not strike so ends. Lat Ob^d 38.15 South Long 43.50

Tuesday Oct 16th 1827 Begins with fresh winds from S & S the ship under reefed top sails many whales in sight struck one cut from her in a squall went on board and took in sail the North and latter part fresh winds and thick weather the ship saying by so ends. Lat Ob^d 38.25 South Long 43.50 West

Wednesday Oct 17th 1827 Begins with fresh winds from S & S and thick weather the ship saying by under a close reefed main top sail and fore sail at 10 P.M. the wind shifted to SE and squally took in the main top sail and fore sail raining through the light the latter part more squally made all sail. I see the shipback so ends. Lat Ob^d 38.28 South Long 44.00

Thursday Oct 18th 1827 Begins with fresh winds from S & S the ship under all sail steering on various courses in search of whales see a number of shipbacks spoke ship Equator Howland of New Bedford at 4 P.M. double reefed the top sails and steered WSW though the light at 8 A.M. took in fore and main top sails and move too heading to the South the latter part rainy weather so ends this day. Lat Ob^d 38.35 South Long 44.30 West

Friday Oct 19th 1827 all these 24 hours light winds from S & S the first an I middle part thick rainy weather the ship saying by the latter part clear weather made all sail an I got one whale so ends. Lat Ob^d 38.51 South Long 44.25 West

Sat Oct 20th 1827 Begins with light winds from East and clear weather the ship saying by the whale at 1 P.M. begin to east at 4 finished and made sail see shipbacks at sundown took in sail from the light an I began to boil at 10 P.M. Rainy at 8 A.M. Boiling the latter part thick rainy weather. Lat Ob^d 38.15 South Long 44.35 West

Sunday Oct 21th 1827 Begins with fresh winds from S & S an I thick Rainy weather the ship saying by under four sail and main top sail heading SSW at 6 P.M. took in the main top sail and fore sail at midnight began to move to the east at daylight set the main top sail on fore sail and began to boil see many whales to Raged to some the boats so ends Boiling an I steering down. Lat Ob^d 38.03 South Long 44.25 West

Monday Oct 22th 1827 Begins with light winds from West and clear weather set double reefed top sail and stood to the Southward and wind see whales I could not strike at sundown close reefed the top sails the latter part the wind shifted to the SE steered to the S. I see many shipbacks an I light whales I could not strike at 8 A.M. finished Boiling. Lat Ob^d 38.15 South Long 44.00

Tuesday Oct 23th 1827 Begins with light winds from S & S see many whales killed 2 one sunk at the other a long fish at sundown fresh winds though the light the latter part cut in the whale so ends Boiling a gale of wind. Lat Ob^d 38.10 South Long 44.40 West
