

Monday November 19th 1827 All these 24 hours fresh gale from the Southward and I went and the Ship under Double Reef top Sails Standing on a wind to the Northward I Shook Ship gear & Porter with 500 bbls and Octavo with five whals at Sun down took in Sail for the night at daylight Made Sail and I Steered on a wind to the Northward and went and went and went for Sail Split the gill took her to ground So Ends Lat Ob^d 39° 12' South Long 45° 30' West

Tuesday November 20th 1827 Begins with fresh wind from SSW the Ship under Double Reef top Sails Standing on a wind to the S.E. at 4 P.M. took in the fore and Mizzen top Sails at Midnight went Ship to the West at daylight More clothed Made Sail See Maney fin back So Ends Lat Ob^d 39° 14' South Long 45° 00' West

Wednesday November 21st 1827 All these 24 hours fresh winds from west the Ship under all Sail Standing on a wind to the Southward at Sun down took in Sail for the night at daylight Made all Sail at 8 A.M. See many Right whales and I got one Struck Struck a better the same got paid Cut from her took the Dead whale to the Ship So Ends Lat Ob^d 39° 27' South Long 45° 20' West

Thursday November 22^d 1827 Begins with fresh wind and Clear weather at 2 P.M. Begin to Cut the whale at Sun down finished and took in Sail and Begin to Boil the 2 Primey with at Midnight Stop Boiling at 8 A.M. Begin to Boil again Made all Sail and Steered on a wind to the wind N.W. and I present with So Ends Boiling Lat Ob^d 40° 22' South Long 45° 35' West

Friday November 23^d 1827 Begins with fine pleasant wind from W.N.W. the Ship under all Sail Standing to the Northward and a wind at Sun down took in main top & Sail and Close Reef the top Sails at 10 P.M. Squally took in fore and Mizzen top Sails at 6 A.M. fresh the fine sail Boiling a gill by Sun So Ends Boiling Lat Ob^d 40° 24' South Long 46° 26' West

Saturday November 24th 1827 Begins with fresh winds from N.W. and Clear weather the Ship Sailing by at 4 P.M. Moderated set the top Sails Close Reef at 10 Squally took them in again at Midnight finished Boiling at 8 A.M. took in the fore Sail and Main top Sail Boiling a gill from S.W. with Squally of gill So Ends Lat Ob^d 40° 23' South Long 46° 00' West

Sunday November 25th 1827 All these 24 hours Boiling a gill from N.W. the Ship Sailing by heading N.W. at 4 P.M. Sent down the Main top gallant yard at Midnight Moderated at the latter part set the Main top Sail Close Reef So Ends

Lat Ob^d 40° 10' South Long 46° 01' By Luner Monday November 26th 1827 Begins with Begins with fresh gale from N.W. the Ship Sailing by heading to the N.W. the latter part Moderated Made Sail Spoke Ship gear and took of fish Redford Tuber had 40 bbls Spun at the latter part Steering N.W. under all Sail So Ends Boiling down Lat Ob^d 39° 55' South Long 46° 55' West

Tuesday November 27th 1827 all these 24 light winds from the Westward and the Ship under all Sail Standing on a wind to the Southward Sent the Main top g yard up and set the Sail So Ends See Maney fin back Lat Ob^d 39° 12' South Long 46° 50' West

Wednesday November 28th 1827 all these 24 hours light winds and pleasant weather the Ship under all Sail Standing to the Northward and a wind from the Westward at 2 P.M. See whales and Struck 2 parts from one and I drew from the other Struck 2 more and killed them and took them in tow at 9 P.M. took one & hung Side at 3 A.M. Cut from the other and went on board and at daylight Begin to Cut the whale at 9 A.M. finished Made Sail and Crossed for the dead about 10 miles off fish So Ends this day Boiling Lat Ob^d 39° 04' South Long 46° 50' West

Thursday October 29th 1827 all these 24 hours light winds from N.W. and Clear weather the Ship under all Sail Standing on a wind to the Eastward at 6 P.M. took in Sail Sail for the night the latter part Made all Sail and Steered S.W. in search of fish So Ends this day Boiling Lat Ob^d 39° 04' South Long 45° 55' West

Friday November 30th 1827 Begins with light winds from N.W. and variable the Ship under all Sail Steering N.W. at Sun down took in Sail for the night the wind S.W. headed West at Midnight finished Boiling the latter part fresh winds and Cloudy the Ship under Double Reef top Sails Standing to the Westward So Ends Boiling down Lat Ob^d 38° 40' South Long 45° 50' West
