

Thursday Feb 7th 1828 The first part Light winds and clear weather the Ship under all sail at 4 PM
See whales Chased and shot Striker at Sundown
Double Brought the top sail and Steer S.W.
The latter part fresh wind from S.W. blowing on
a wind S.W. The first part in blue water no bottom
with 400 fathoms the latter part green water
So ends running boat S.W. Lat 46.38

Friday Feb 8th 1828 Begins with fresh wind from
S.W. the Ship under all sail Stand down to
the S.W. the Middle Light winds at 4 PM the wind
shifts to the Eastward Steer S.W. See 2 whales
Chased and shot Striker 2 Ships in sight
So ends the wind S.W. Lat 46.11.30 South 63 fathoms

Sat Feb 9th 1828 Begins with fresh wind from South west
the Ship under all sail running for whales See 2 whales
Chased and shot Striker at 5 PM Steer S.W.

Enter fringe of harbor with 6 whales at sundown
Double Brought the top sail and Boat to windward
through the night at daylight made all sail and
stood to the South with the wind from West
So ends from west. No whales Lat 46.02 South

Sunday Feb 10th 1828 All the 24 hours Light
winds from South the Ship under all sail
running for whales See 2 Chased 3 hours could not
Striker at Sundown Double Brought the top sail
Spoke Ship. Ground tank with 200 bbls
alters 2 South through the night at daylight
Made all sail Spoke Ship. Munches with
600 bbls. More than 1000 Chobbs 200 So ends
Lat 46.12 South 62 fathoms

Monday Feb 11th 1828 The first part Light winds from
South and clear weather the Ship under all sail
steering South at Sundown down in sail for
the night at daylight made sail at 8 AM the 12
miles back at dawn See one whale
Chased and shot Striker So ends thick fog
3 Ships in sight No Obd Lat 46.21

Tuesday Feb 12th 1828 Begins with thick fog the
Ship lying A Back at 2 PM the wind shifts
to South and the fog lifted up Made all sail stood
to the East See whales heard Chased and shot
Striker at Sundown took in sail Light winds
through the night at daylight Made all sail
Chased all the forenoon could not Striker
So ends 5 Ships in sight Lat 46.30 South

Wednesday Feb 13th 1828 Begins with Light winds and clear
weather the Ship under all sail See many whales
killed one took her along side at 5 PM took in sail
Light winds through the night at daylight Calm
at 6 AM began to cut the school at 9 finished
Made all sail and began to boil So ends
Light breeze from North 5 Ships in sight and
cutting and one boiling Lat 46.31 South

Thursday Feb 14th 1828 Begins with fresh wind from S.W.
See plenty whales Chased could not Striker at sundown
took in sail the Middle and latter part blowing again
at 8 PM the wind shifted to South see one whale to
be killed to land So ends Boiling Lat 46.30 South

Friday Feb 15th 1828 The first part blowing again from South
the Ship lying by the Middle Nordröche the latter part
Light winds the Ship under all sail See 2 whales
at 10 AM finished Boiling So ends Lat 46.15 South
78 fathoms water

Sat Feb 16th 1828 Begins with light winds and
pleasant weather the Ship under all sail See 4
hundred whales Chased and killed one and spoke
the Middle and latter part blowing again from
West stood down So ends 8 Ships in sight
Lat 46.31 South 78 fathoms water

Sunday Feb 17th 1828 All the 24 hours Light
winds from West the first part See 2 whales Chased
could not Striker stood to the Southward all
night at daylight made all sail See whales heard
and killed one at 11 AM took her along side
and began to cut So ends Lat 46.41 South

Monday Feb 18th 1828 Begins with Light winds from
N.W. and clear weather lying by the school at 4 PM
finished cutting and began to boil at Sundown took in
sail spoke Ship. Amagan with 800 bbls the Middle and
latter part blowing again So ends Boiling
Lat 46.48 South
