

Sunday Feb 19th 1828 All the forenoon, blowing a gale from S.S.W. the first part the ship under double reef top sails standing to the westward and at 4 P.M. took in fore and main top sail and double reefed the other main at 2 A.M. took in the fore sail and close reefed the main square with rain and hail at 10 finished heeling so as to bring a gale S.W. by S. 46. 04 South

Wednesday Feb 20th 1828 Began with a gale from S.S.W. the ship laying by at 2 P.M. spoke ships Argonaut and Ann Alexander both bound for home the Middle Mon. at the latter part set double reefed top sails and stood on as in S.W. the wind from West stood down the oil so ended this day 3 ships in sight Lat 46. 38 South

Thursday Feb 21st 1828 Began with a gale from N.W. the ship under double reefed top sails steering S.W. fresh winds through the night the latter part more weathered made all sail sun shades (Chand) could not strike so ended 7 ships in sight Lat 46. 47 South

Friday Feb 22^d 1828 Began with fresh wind from N.W. the ship under all sail steering on a wind N.E. at 4 P.M. spoke ship Milwaukee with 700 Bbls and Resan (D) with 400 at sundown took in sail the latter part the wind shifted to S.W. and increased to a gale 3 ships in sight so ended Lat 46. 29 South

Sat Feb 23^d 1828 Began with a gale from S.S.W. the ship laying by the Middle Mon. at the latter part the wind shifted to S.W. made all sail and stood to the Southward on a wind spoke ship Sally Ann of New Bedford with 1550 Bbls so ended Lat 46. 30 South

Sunday Feb 24th 1828 Began with light winds from West the ship under all sail standing to the South on a wind see what song Chand could not strike at sundown took in sail for the night the Middle fresh wind began at 10 A.M. see what made sail Chand could not strike so ended this Lat 46. 41 South 3 ships in sight

Monday Feb 25th 1828 All the forenoon fresh wind from West the ship under all sail the latter part the wind shifted to S.W. spoke ship plenty whaler Chand could not strike 9 sail in sight Lat 46. 39 South

Tuesday Feb 26th 1828 Began with the Mon. on a wind from S.W. the ship under all sail standing on a wind spoke ship Martha with 1100 Bbls at sundown took in sail the Middle and latter part blowing a gale so ended 9 ships in sight Lat 46. 52 South

Wednesday Feb 27th 1828 the first part the weather clearing the latter part the Mon. on a clear day sun came out but could not strike 4 ships in sight Lat 47. 25 South

Thursday Feb 28th 1828 the first part the weather clearing the latter part the ship under all sail standing to the South at 4 P.M. sun down took in sail at 8 A.M. set double reefed top sail and stood S.W. fresh wind through the night the latter part blowing a gale from S.W. took in sail so ended Lat 47. 17 South 5 ships in sight

Friday Feb 29th 1828 Began with a gale from N.W. the ship laying by the Middle light wind the latter part calm sea at sundown see what Chand took in to so ended this day Lat 46. 54 South 4 ships in sight

Sat March 1st 1828 Began with a calm all 3 boats to the whaler to the ship at sundown got under way the latter part the ship began on and took in sail the Middle part had a light breeze from the Northward at daylight began to cut the isph. at 10 A.M. finished made all sail and began to heave to so ended standing to the Westward on a wind 5 sail in sight spoke ship Boston Swain of New Bedford with 1100 Bbls Lat 46. 43 South

Sun. day March 2^d 1828 Began with light winds from N.W. the ship under all sail see what Chand took in to so ended this Lat 46. 44 South 3 ships in sight

Monday March 3^d 1828 Began with a gale from S.S.W. the ship laying by under all close reefed main top sail and set top sails at 4 P.M. stopped heeling at midnight the weather moderated set the fore sail and began to heave at daylight made all sail at 8 A.M. the wind shifted to S.W. sun shades Chand could not strike so ended heeling 13 ships in sight Lat 46. 13 South

Tuesday March 4th 1828 began with light winds from S.W. the ship under all sail see and Chand at sundown took in sail the latter part the wind shifted to S.W. spoke ship plenty whaler Chand could not strike 9 sail in sight Lat 46. 26 South at midnight finished heeling
