

Wednesday May 8th 1828 Begins with fair
winds from South the ship under full sail
topails standing to the westward
the Schooner Breeze started in to the
harbour at 9 AM and anchored to the
Southward of the fort light winds though the
light at day light but the Cape well up to town
on Breeze's side this day

Thursday May 9th 1828 All these 24 hours light
winds and fine weather at 11 AM the boat
came from town the people employed
doing ship duty so ends
Lat 08°

Lat May 10th 1828 All these 24 hours fine weather
from SE the boat crew on liberty
one boat crew on shore and liberty
the others employed doing ship duty
getting off water and so ends this

Sunday May 11th 1828 All these 24 hours pleasant
the wind from SE the boat crew on liberty
and doing ship duty so ends day

Monday May 12th 1828 All these 24 hours fine
weather people on liberty to shore and
blacking ship Breeze getting off water from
the shore - 20 sail of the Brazilian
fleet came to anchor at the mouth
of the harbour so ends this day

Tuesday May 13th 1828 fine weather the wind
from South the boat went to land
and returned again part of the crew on
shore on liberty the others employed
getting off water and doing ship
duty

Wednesday May 14th All these 24 hours fine
weather people employed doing ship duty
so ends this day

Thursday May 15th 1828 Begins with a calm
at 10 PM the Schooner Breeze came to
Capit Breeze at 9 AM got underway with
a fine breeze from North West and so
out of the harbour so ends pleasant weather

Friday May 16th 1828 Begins with light winds
from SE the ship under all sail steering
East the SE point of the Schooner Breeze
South 6 miles from which the Schooner Breeze
the latter part fine weather wind from
NW set all standing sail and steered SE
Lat 08° 24' 25" South Long 46° 40' West

Sat May 17th 1828 Begins with light winds from
SE the ship under all sail steering SE
the latter part the wind from SE took
in standing sail so ends squally
Lat 08° 24' 00" South Long 45° 08' West

Sunday May 18th 1828 Begins with fresh winds
from SE the ship under all sail the at water
Anchored steering SE at 6 PM the wind shifted
to SE and squally took in two of sails
the fore and main and the fore and main
and at 8 PM the ship to SE at 10 hours
spray and rain took in the main sail
the latter part of the night the wind at day
light turned the ship out of the top set the
main sail main top of sail and fore and
the ship standing to the SE on a wind
so ends this day Lat 08° 27' 27" South Long 44° 19' 45"

Monday May 19th 1828 All these 24 hours fine weather
from SE the ship under all sail standing
to the Eastward and steered SE at 4 PM
the Schooner Breeze standing on a wind to the East
so ends day Lat 08° 28' 46" South Long 43° 01'
