Thursday this day calm saw plain locks

by the region for ends Lat 44.00 Long

the current & settings sets S 44 W 1/2 S 88

Thursday December the 10th 1895
this day light wind & calm headed to the
S 44 W 1/2 S saw black fish locks
the fish being very wild did not strike
the current setting a net to the S 44 W 1/2 S

So ends this day Lat 44.00 Long 230.00 89

Friday December the 11th 1895
this day a strong breeze from the S E
was S 44 W 1/2 S by day compass under full sail
at 8 it was very strong tide set
setting from the N E to the S 44 W 1/2 S

the watch impleid it waves by
So ends this day Lat 44.00 Long 240.00 90

Saturday December the 12th 1895
this day light wind from the S E
breeze steared S 44 W 1/2 S the watch
impleid it waves by So ends this day Lat 44.00 Long 250.00 91
