

Thursday January the 14th 1896
this day strong winds from the S.W.
Corse stand E.S. & 6 h. all men & shales
of right whole load & boats got nothing
returned to the ship the watch in place
the waves high at 4 P.M. but the fore
top sail and bent it rather
So ends this day Lat 34.50 Long 124.30 124

Friday January the 15th 1896
this day strong winds from the S.W.
Corse stand E.S. & the watch in place
the repairing the fore boat looking at
that so forth
So ends this day Lat 35.00 Long 125 125

Saturday January the 16th 1896
this day present breeze and warcel
the watch in place at 5th bar open
and warceling the mast
So ends this day Lat 35.50 Long 126 126

Sunday January the 17th 1896
this day calm and light winds
saw a caribbees and plenty of birds
So ends this day Lat 36.00 Long 127 127

Monday January the 18th 1896
this day calm saw porpoises black fish
grampages hils and so forth the watch
in place the waves high
So ends this day Lat 36.50 Long 128 128

Tuesday January the 19th 1896
this day light winds and calm
the ship was steered S.E. & the watch
in place the waves high
So ends this day Lat 36.50 Long 129 129

Wednesday January the 20th 1896
this day light winds from the W. saw several whales
the watch in place the ship duty was high
So ends Sat 36.50 Long 130 130

Thursday January the 21st 1896
this day strong gales from the S.W.
with squalls rain Corse stand was E.S. &
the watch in place the waves high
shortened sail & cautiously
So ends this day Lat 37.00 Long 131 131

Friday January the 22nd 1896
this day fine breeze from the S.W. stand
E.S. at 12 P.M. light left to the wind
and shortened to the 1/2 at 1 P.M. 6 P.M.
half 1/2 made sail the watch in place
the waves high ends this day Lat 37.00 Long 132 132

Saturday January the 23rd 1896
this day light winds from the W. with it
a heavy swell from the W. at 9 P.M. struck into
green water at 11 P.M. sawed got 40 fathoms
of water Corse stand E.S. the watch
in place the waves high
So ends this day Lat 37.00 Long 133 133

Sunday January the 24th 1896
this day light breeze and warcel at
10 P.M. saw the land the Cape of
good hope having E.S. 9 leagues
stand E.S. until 6 P.M. then left
on the wind with barbed tack & stand
Morned to the best of our nolog then
the night to be of Cape town in the
morning at 11 P.M. saw it right of the
town at 4 P.M. stand away for the town
shortened sail . So ends this day 134
