

Sunday February the 21st 1836
this day variable winds in puffs and
squalls with fog round the ship so that
steered S by E under what sail we could
suffer it is beyond the port of the
to no what sail to carry
So ends this day 169

Monday February the 22nd 1836
this day light winds calm squalls and in
gusts of wind beyond the port of the
th to form any idea of the winds in
this place this is the best part
th it took it gale from the N by W
th had seen on board the ship under a
close reefed main top sail and fore sail
steered S by E so ends this day 164

Tuesday February the 23rd 1836
this day the heaviest part of strong gale from
the N we were at standing to the S under
a close reefed main top sail and fore
sail reefed and fore top mast stay sail
th it the other 2 boats we made sail
th the ship required this 24 hours end
with fine weather and smooth seas
under all sail saw some porpoises in
green water and men left saw nothing
worth notes so ends this day Lat 37° 40' N
Long 26° 14' W 165

Wednesday February the 24th 1836
this day heavy squalls from the N by W the
th 24 hours the wind S by E under full
sail th the ship required
so ends this day in green water 166

Thursday February the 25th day
this day began and ended with squalls
made and shortened sail at casually
so ends this day green water 167

Friday February the 26th 1836
this day began with tremendous heavy squalls
and ended with the same so that we were
hard to run under short sail th it took
a very heavy squall so that we could not
suffer a spare sail on the ship nothing
but a fore topmast stay sail going 9 knots
to the S by the squalls prevail from the
th close steered S by E in green water
so ends this day Lat 38° 23' N Long 31° 31' W 168

Saturday February the 27th 1836
this day squally weather with some rain
made and shortened sail at casually
wind from the N by W close steered S by E
so ends this day Lat 38° 44' N Long 31° 50' W 169

Sunday February the 28th 1836
this day strong wind and heavy squalls with
some rain made and shortened sail at casually
the wind varied from the N by W to the S by
close steered S by E so ends this day
Lat 38° 59' N Long 31° 50' W 170

Monday February the 29th 1836
this day pleasant weather and smooth seas
saw nothing worth notes wind from
the N by W close steered S by E under all sail
so ends this day Lat 38° 51' N Long 41° 15' W
March the 1st 1836 171

Tuesday February the 2nd
this day pleasant weather with fine
breeze from the N by W close steered and
S by E saw nothing but blew water
and birds the watch imployed at
nothing yards making Spanish Mon
ing sails and other necessary jobs
so ends this day Lat 38° 53' N Long 42° 24' W
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
