

Wednesday March the 2^d 1896
this day present light wind
from the N.W. Stear. S.E. by E under
all sail it very smooth see the watch
implied it repairing sails
So ends this day Lat 38.45 Long 44.05 173

Thursday March the 3^d 1896
this day present weather windy from
from the N.W. Stear. S.E. by E
under all sail saw several birds back
the watch implied it repairing sails
So ends this day Lat 39.20 Long 44.00 Saw 3 birds
to the N. of us Stear. S.E. 174

Friday March the 4th 1896
this day present weather with a smooth
see wind from the N.W. Stear. S.E. by E
under all sail the watch implied
waves sail mending sails and so forth
So ends this day Lat 39.40 Long 50.15 175

Saturday March the 5th 1896
this present weather wind from the
N.W. Stear. S.E. by E under
all sail saw several birds back the
watch implied it waves sail mending
sails and so forth
So ends this day Lat 39.40 Long 54.30 176

Sunday March the 6th 1896
the part of this 24 ours light wind
and foggy with some rain made from
the N.W. Stear. S.E. by E under all
sail at 8 A.M. the rain fell in torrents
took in the blankets and gaff top
sail at 9 P.M. the wind took the ship
back from the S. hoisted it round the
yard took in the Studding Sails and rain

top galant and main sail hoisted the
ship to the Close reef for the main top
sails it all have sail and stay sails
luff sharp by the wind to the S.E.
the wind continued to blow strong
and the sea raised very fast
saw some birds back 178
So ends this day Lat Long 55.15

Monday March the 7th 1896
this day a gale of wind from the S to
the S.E. being heavy lay by the
wind on 4 our backs catch wing we
have plenty of fog and rain the ship
lay by very long and free from water
So ends this day Lat 39.30 Long 55.15 179

Tuesday February the 8th 1896
this day a heavy gale from the S with it had
see the gale continued to blow through the 24 hours
we lay head to the S by the wind under the
stay and 1 Chart reef main top sail it all
were ship to the South this is a heavy gale
So ends this day Lat 40.00 Long 55.15 180

Wednesday March the 9th 1896
this move move it it all have sail
it had see in San Diego and rain
made sail it it cabin required the
crew in place it putting the cutting
gear getting the points of light
So ends this day Lat 39.22 Long 56.00 181

Thursday March the 10th 1896
this day strong wind from the N.W. Stear. S.E.
with a heavy sea from the N.W. plenty of
squalls of wind and rain saw plenty of
birds Albatross and the birds of kind we are in
green water So ends this day
Lat 40.30 Long 60.27 182
