

Friday March the 11th 1896

this day strong gales from the NW to the N
Course steered ESE shortened sail & cautiously
a very heavy sea on the ship labored heavy
saw nothing worth note except squalls
the watch in place at 11 o'clock
the ship was in green water this day E
So ends this day Lat 39.94 Long 65.00 183

Saturday March the 12th 1896

this day a strong gale from the NW Course steered was
ESE with a heavy sea from the NW the ship was
a going six miles per hour then the day under short
sail saw plenty of porpoises the watch were in place
a reason required
So ends this day Lat 39.37 Long 75.15 184

Sunday March the 13th 1896

this day pleasant breeze from the NW to the N Course
steered E under all sail with a smooth sea
saw plenty of porpoises & small fish
So ends this day Lat 39.49 Long 74.10 185

Monday March the 14th 1896

this day first part pleasant weather mild part
the same later part strong wind coming from
NW to NE we ran under full sail to the
E saw nothing worth remarking at 11 o'clock hauled
the ship by wind to the NW and lay 2 days and
then were ship and lay in till 4 o'clock then
put it away for S. palls the weather was squally
did not think it fit to make it at 14 put the
hike Course ESE for Wandimans land about 30 miles
south of S. palls the weather was thick did not see it
So ends this day Lat 39.21 Long 79.40 E 186

Tuesday March the 15th 1896

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this day a strong gale from the NW to the NE
Course steered ESE under patchel fore & ab
sail with a high sea after us at 6 o'clock
saw a large sperm whale & going to the N
very quick did not trouble him he was to turn
and the weather was rough with plenty
of squalls of wind and rain 187
So ends this day Lat 39.59 Long 82.94 E

Wednesday March the 16th 1896

this strong winds from the NW quite dry with
squalls of rain Course steered was ESE under
a shipshape press of sail saw nothing worth note
So ends this day Lat 39.49 Long 86.31 E 188

Thursday March the 17th 1896

this day strong winds from the NW to the NE
with the heavy squalls of wind & rain Course
steered ESE under a heavy press of sail
striking sails top galant and so forth saw
nothing remarkable the watch in place
at 11 o'clock on ship's duty 189
So ends this day Lat 39.50 Long 89.14 E

Friday March the 18th 1896

the first part of this day strong winds
from the NW mild and later part
moderate breeze with some rain Course
steered by compass was ESE under all
sail the watch in place at 11 o'clock
So ends this day Lat 39.40 Long 93.40 E 190

Saturday March the 19th 1896

this day fine breeze from the NW Course
steered was ESE under all sail the watch
in place at 11 o'clock saw plenty
of small birds and other things
So ends this day Lat 38.57 Long 96.34 E 191
