

Wednesday May the 4th 1836
This day first part strong winds from the
& the weather was squally we were unpleas'd
at hitting up to the land under a press
of sail at 6 p.m. Cape Horn here Ship 141/142
at 6 p.m. we lay off the bay of islands
amongst them we entered the bay and passed Cape
Horn first bearing down & ships to the Starboard
hand & we kept the Starboard hand Shore 225
So ends this day

Thursday May the 5th 1836
This day pleasant weather the wind was
light at 2 p.m. set go the anchor at
the head of the bay in 5 fathoms of
water the ships lay well off in the
bay we anchored at the point on the left
the water in port the cleaning ship 226
So ends this day

Friday May the 6th 1836
This day in weather the hands employed
at cleaning ship painting stow & forth 227
So ends this day

Saturday May the 7th 1836
This day fine weather. All hands employed at
getting wood. 228

Sunday May the 8th 1836
Fine weather all this day. Starboard watch
ashore on Liberty. 229

Monday May the 9th 1836
Squally weather this day. all hands employed
at getting wood. 230

Tuesday May 10th 1836
Squally weather this day. All hands employed
at getting wood 231

Wednesday May the 11th 1836
This day pleasant weather wind from the
& the ships Company in port at ships duty
down it left the bay 232
So ends this

Thursday May the 11th 1836
This day pleasant weather the ships Company
in port at moving water tenting & other
other duty. 233

Friday May the 12th 1836
This day pleasant weather the Company
employed at ships duty & ships left
this day for the crews 234
So ends this day

Saturday May the 13th 1836
This day squally weather the crew in port
at duty painting stow & forth 235
So ends this day

Sunday May the 14th 1836
This day pleasant weather & watch
at shore on liberty 236
So ends this day

Monday May the 15th 1836
This day strong gales from the & with
squalls of the watch at shore on liberty
the other watch on duty 237
So ends this day

Tuesday the 16th 1836
This day strong gales with rain in
towns So ends this day 238

Wednesday May the 17th 1836
This day more pleasant the crew in
port at stowing water tenting & other
duty lashed the sails and read them 239
So ends this day
