

Friday June the 24th 1836
This day first part strong winds Mistel and
later part moderate with a heavy swell
from the S.W. winds were westerly
headed to the S. and W. a barque ship in
company with us did not know her
name saw her back and did not see her
so ends this day Lat 26° 45' Long 184° 276

Saturday June the 25th 1836
this day light winds from the N.W. we
saw several fish back and a bark ship
in company with us made and shortened
sail at last only at 4 it broke out
but the fore peak and but the ship
from and all the help we could get
so ends this day Lat 26° 10' Long 183° 10' 277

Sunday June the 26th 1836
this day light winds first part sun
rain later part pleasant at 9 A.M. saw 2
large whales about the bow and hood
got 1 chased the other with out success
at 4 P.M. took the whale at long side
finched stowing the sharks in the fore
peak at 6 P.M. commenced cutting the
ship in company with
so ends this day Lat 26° 04' Long 184° 278

Monday June the 27th 1836
This day light winds with pleasant weather
Commenced cutting in at 6 o'clock A.M. and got
the whale in at 8 o'clock and commenced boiling
at 8 P.M. Our Lat this day 26° 09' Long 184° 279

Tuesday June 28th 1836
This day pleasant weather and westerly
we were in paid at looking down on the
so ends this day Lat 26° 40' Long 184° 280

Wednesday June the 29th 1836
A gale from the E. steered to take
the night and saw ship to the
so ends this day Lat 26° 25' Long 185° 281
