up fish back at 11.45 at 12.45 a ship
passed under no lee at 3.45 a more ship
to the S.E. at 4.45 at 5.45 3 ships in site
1 of hailing the American of mantauck
the black star and the plough boy all

Sunday July the 1st 1836
this day strong winds and a high sea

Monday July the 2nd 1836
this day strong winds from the
N.W. at 6.45 a ship at site of the

Tuesday July the 3rd 1836
this day a gale from the N.W. steamed

steamed by the wind to the M. at 8.45
at 11.45 a more ship to the S.W. under

So ends this day Satt 25.15 Long 183.55

Sunday July the 8th 1836
this day the gale & hatered and the
wind hatered to the S with a heavy
squall from the N.W. at 4.45 a more ship
fore top sail. Sil and spunkies turned
1 red out of the main top sail the white
implied at venting potatoes
So ends this day Satt 25.15 Long 183.10
