

Wednesday July the 20th 1896
this day pleasant weather it rained
saw a long whale land the Larkin
boat struck the whale and got
stone at a blow the whale it
long side clear and the Jacks and
60 blubs of oil between Jacks and
got ready for cutting at 4 P.M. 309
Commenced cutting
So ends this day Lat 26.00 Long 184.12

Thursday July the 21st 1896
this day pleasant weather it got thrown
cutting and commenced hauling under
short sail hauled to the E. wind from
the N.W. light and it smooth sea
spoke the large ship Clarkston of
Savoy 6 Men 15 Months 1240 blubs oil
So ends this day Lat 25.49 Long 184.39 310

Friday July the 22nd 1896
this day pleasant weather saw several
fin hawks we are implead it boiling
wind from the N. and to the N.
So ends this day Lat 25.00 Long 184.99 305

Saturday July the 23rd 1896
this day thick men cast sky saw fin
at 6 P.M. the Captain of the Clark
ston of Savoy came it hauled and spent
the day at 12 mereday we at throw
hauling Calm then hauling
So ends this day Lat 24.12 Long 184.12 306

Sunday July the 24th 1896 wind E
this day strong gales and rain in tonemts
saw sun for 20 min at 6 P.M. lost site
of the Clarkston we shortened sail
to a close reef main top sail and
stay sails so ends this day Lat 23.30 Long 184.09 307

Monday July the 25th 1896
all this day a gale from the N.W. with
rain sun thunder and lightning heeded
to the S.W. at 4 P.M. wore ship to the
N.E. long by the wind under a close
reef main top sail and stay sails
saw fin hawks
So ends this day Lat 23.49 Long 184.90 308

Tuesday July the 26th 1896
this day a gale and a high sea lay by
the wind to the N.E. under short
sail at 6 P.M. commenced mending a
stowing boat
So ends this day Lat 24.00 Long 184.49 319

Wednesday July the 27th 1896
this day strong winds from the N.W.
steered N.W. by the wind saw 1 fin
hawk it very low see in the ship role
at about 10
So ends this day Lat 24.00 Long 184.00 310

Thursday July the 28th 1896
this day pleasant weather winds from
the N.W. steered N.W. by the wind at 7
P.M. spoke the large ship Psyche &
moved 4 months from Savoy 600 blubs oil
we are under short sail all hands
implead it stinging rain
So ends this day Lat 24.00 Long 184.49 311

Friday July the 29th 1896
this day pleasant weather with light
wind from the N.W. steered N.W. to the N.W.
at 6 P.M. saw a ship pass to the windward
of us we were free the later part of the
day under light sail all hands in place
at 10 P.M. saw sun fin hawks
So ends this day Lat 24.00 Long 184.00 312
